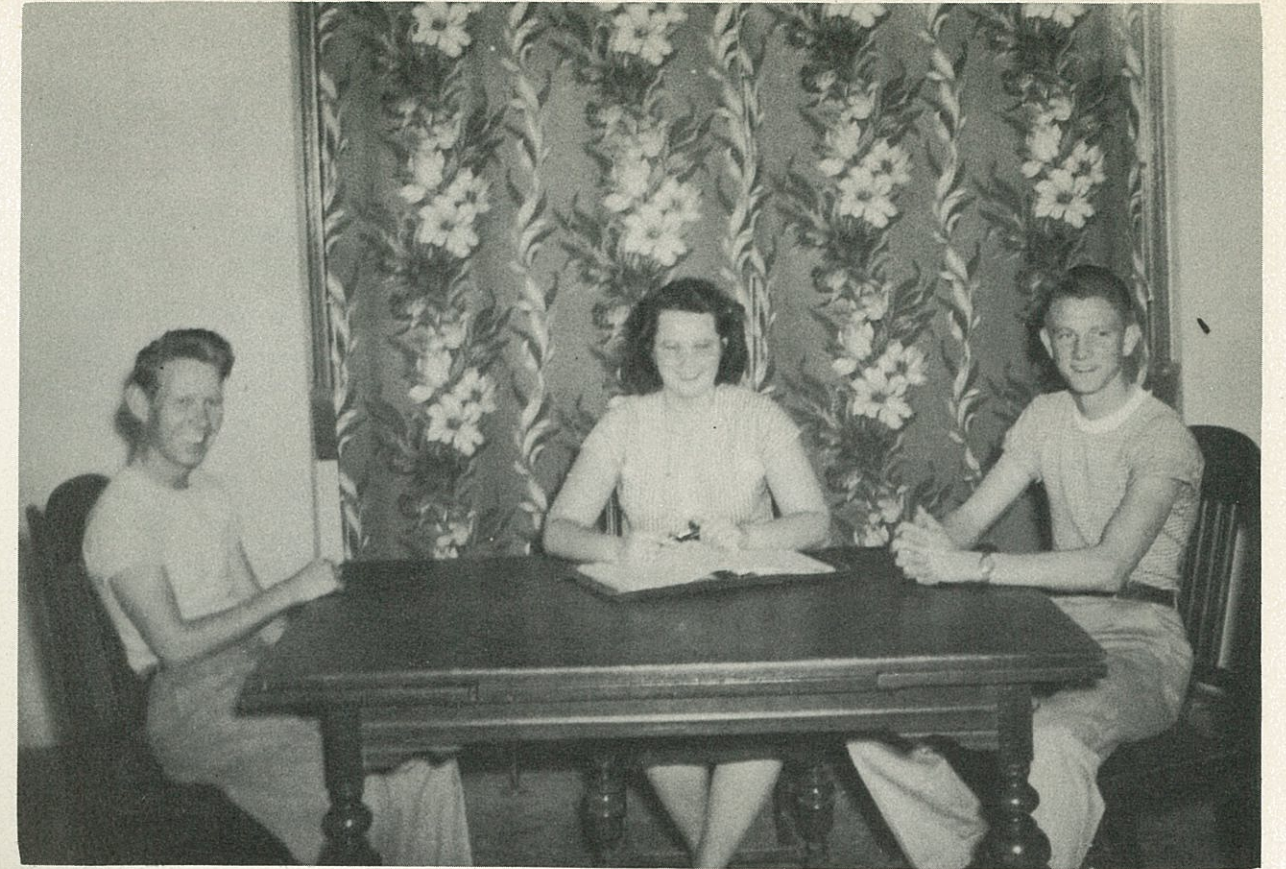
LETA BLUNDELL

STUDENT COUNCIL

The student council of KHS was established in the spring of 1941 and sponsored by the Civics class under the supervision of Tommy Thompson, principal.

Its purpose is to form a more democratic organization, insure loyalty, establish good citizenship, improve student-faculty relations, promote school spirit, and provide clean recreation for all.

The council of 1946-47, led by Leon Barnes, undertook many projects. They sponsored a volleyball tournament during the noon hour, set up a schedule of assembly programs for the year, sponsored dances after football and basketball games, welcomed visiting football teams, sponsored the Halloween Carnival which provided funds for all classes and clubs, and worked continually for the betterment of KHS.
