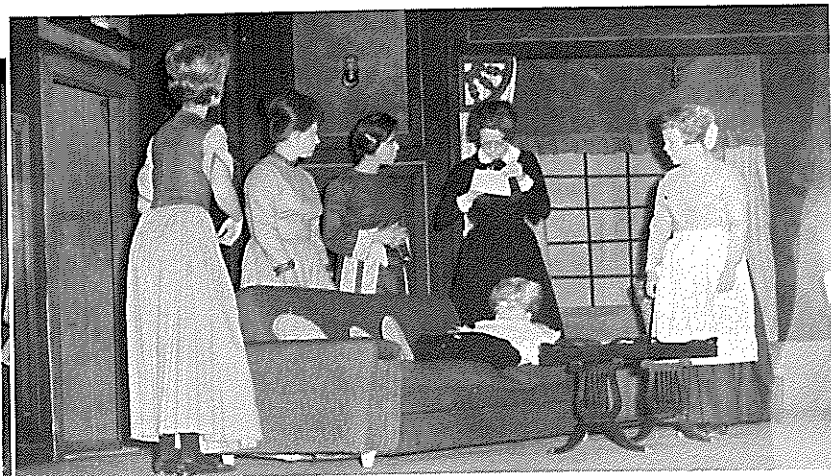
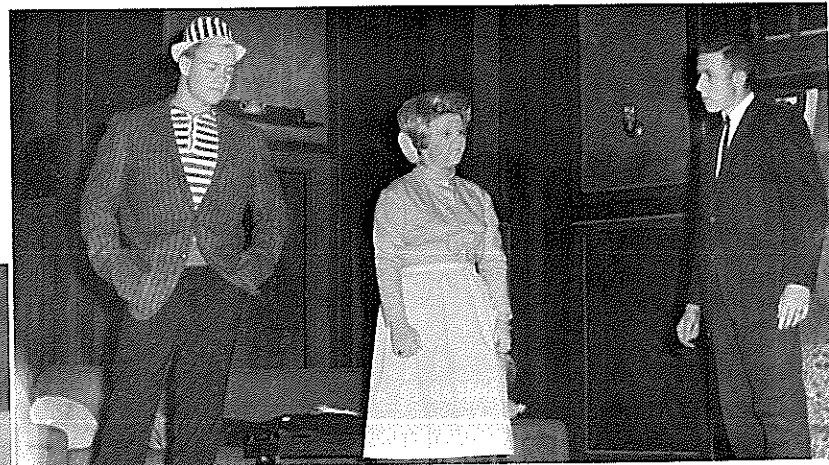


Seniors Present "Bull in a China Shop"



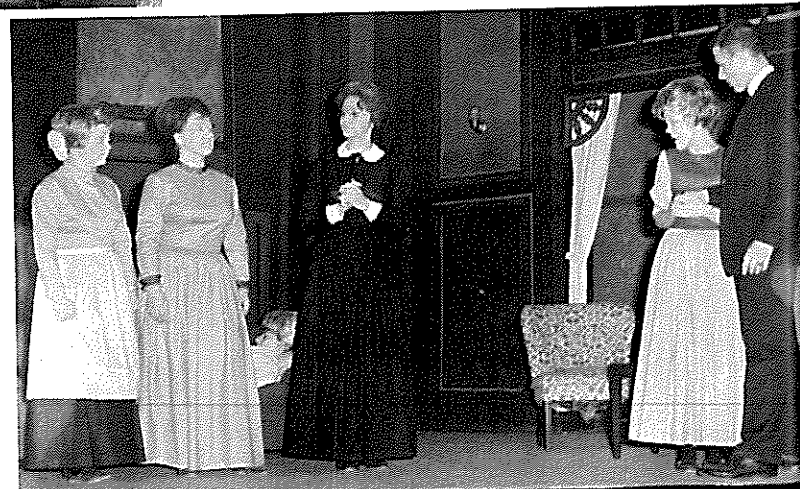
These five "old ladies" gave their most cherished possessions to Charlotte Brown, who has just died of poisoning.

Tax Collector Earl Gartman sells poll tax to members of the Senior class.

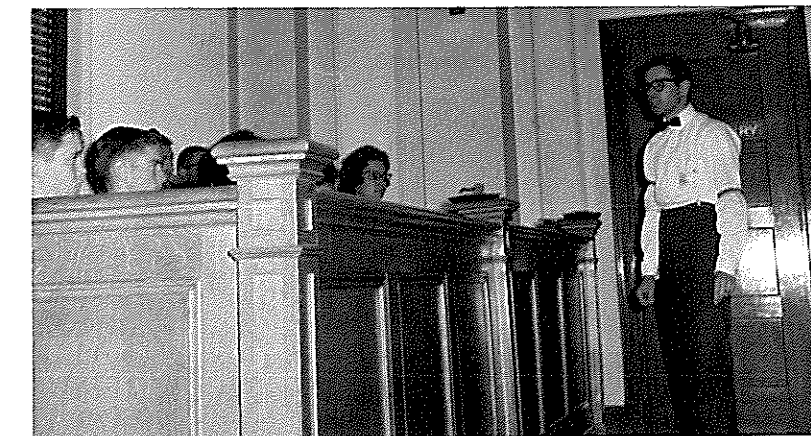
For County Government Day, all civic classes are divided in such a way as to form two political parties called the Federalist party and the Nationalist party. One party attempts to adopt a conservative program while the other--a liberal program. Each party holds primary elections for county positions. A general election is held; and successful candidates hold these positions on County Government Day. A "crime" is planned and executed; and county officials are required to "solve" the crime; while all Seniors participate in a mock trial the afternoon of County Government Day.

All activities culminate in a banquet held that evening sponsored by the American Legion. Real lawyers from the Winkler County Bar Association lend authenticity to the trial and all the seniors agree that it is a fine way to learn about government at the local level.
