Seniors realized how much the school song meant when the band played "We'll cheer for our high school-----" at the last football game.

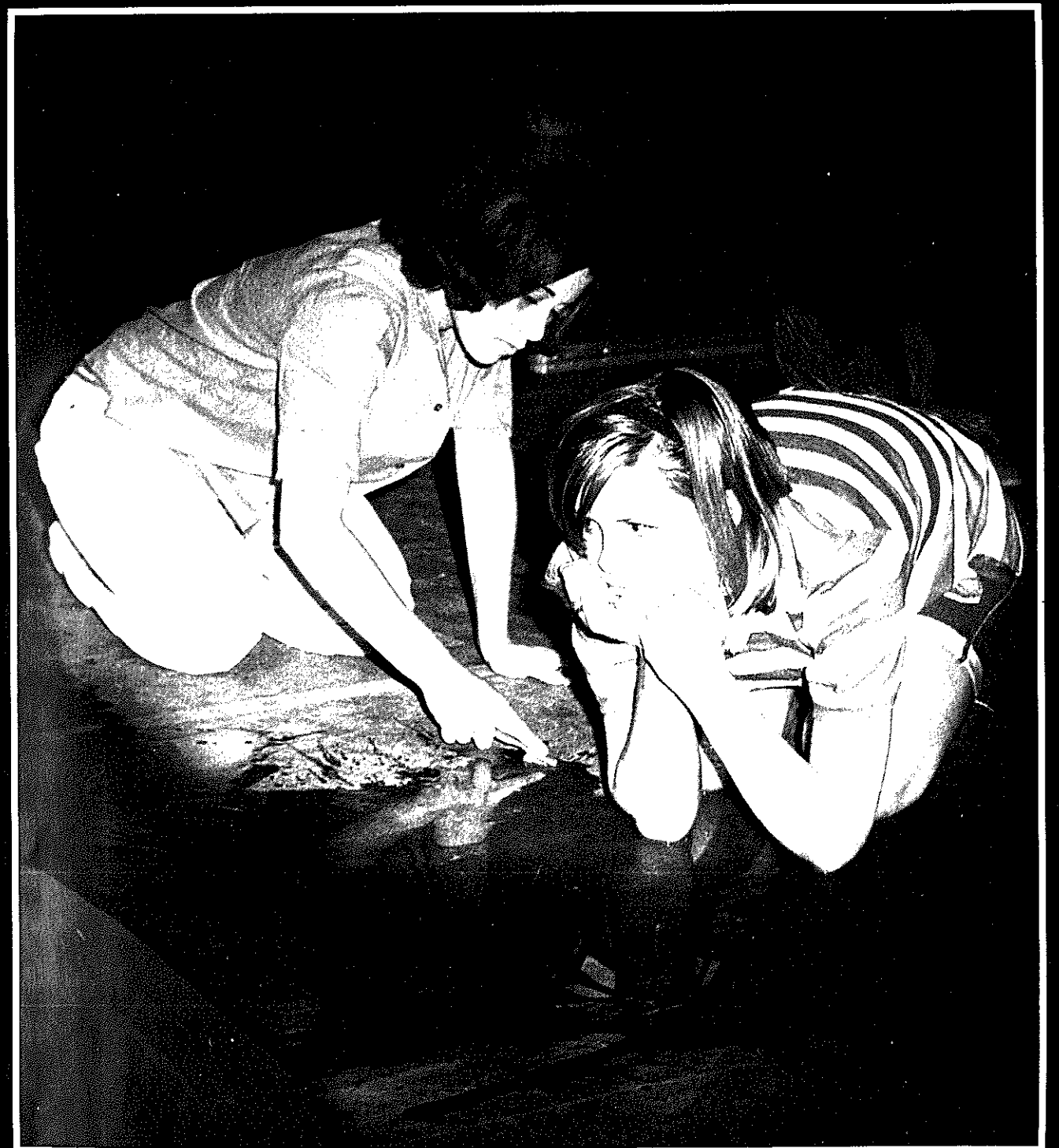
Fall also brought ballgames, pep rallies, victory dances, drama productions and the beginning of Kermit's reign as president of the Texas Association of Student Councils.
