

Yellow Jackets Post 7-3 Mark; Finish Second in District

Jackets compiled a 7-3 record and finished second in district in their '64 season.

They opened the season September 12 against the Hobbs Eagles. The Jackets held them scoreless as they pounded out a 9-0 victory.

On September 18, the Jackets met the Carlsbad Spartans and kept their opponents scoreless in a 9-0 win.

In their second defense continued to sparkle as they defeated El Paso Irvin 28-0.

The Jackets went into their Homecoming game undefeated and ranked first in AAA circles. The Homecoming game and knocked the Spartans from their lofty ranking with a 15-0 win.

In their first district play October 9, and they defeated the Los Angeles Eagles a 21-6 shellacking. They also lost a heartbreaker to the Al-

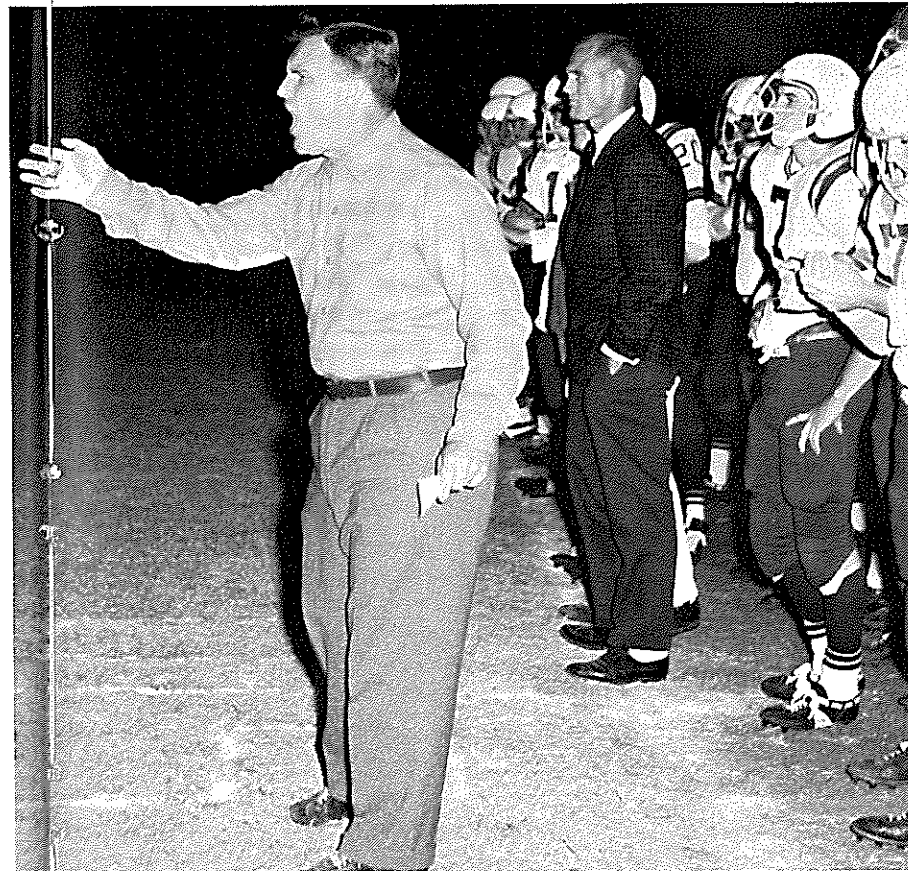

The maroon and gold stung the Fort Stockton Panthers to a tune of 42-14, October 30. The Jackets were ahead 34-0 at halftime, and the reserves played the entire second half.

November 6, the Jackets staged a comeback to defeat the Monahans Lobos 20-9. Monahans took a quick 9-0 lead but never crossed the double stripe again as the Jackets racked up 20 points.

Friday the 13th was no jinx for the Jackets as they ripped through the Ector Eagles for 28 points. The Kermit defense arose to the occasion and held the Eagles to 121 yards and no score.

November 20, the Jackets traveled to Seminole and were upset 17-13 in the final game of the season.

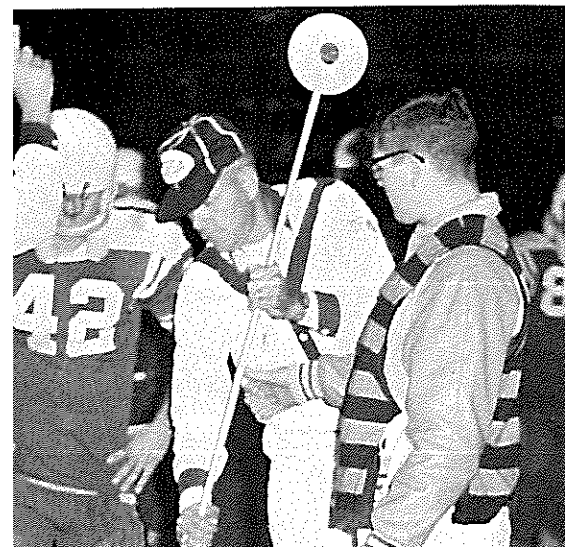


"Hold 'em," shouts Coach Jetton as Coach Turner grimly looks on.
