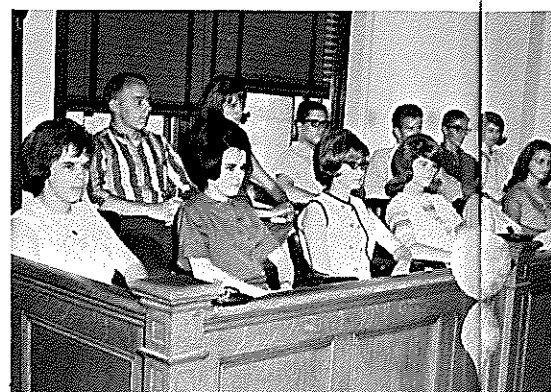
Defendants Randy and Kathy confer with their lawyers Larry and Mr. Robinson.



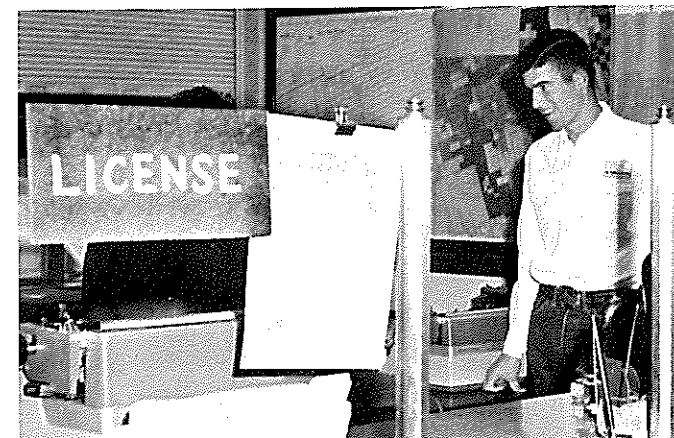
Prosecuting Attorney Lonnie persuades jury of the defendants' guilt.



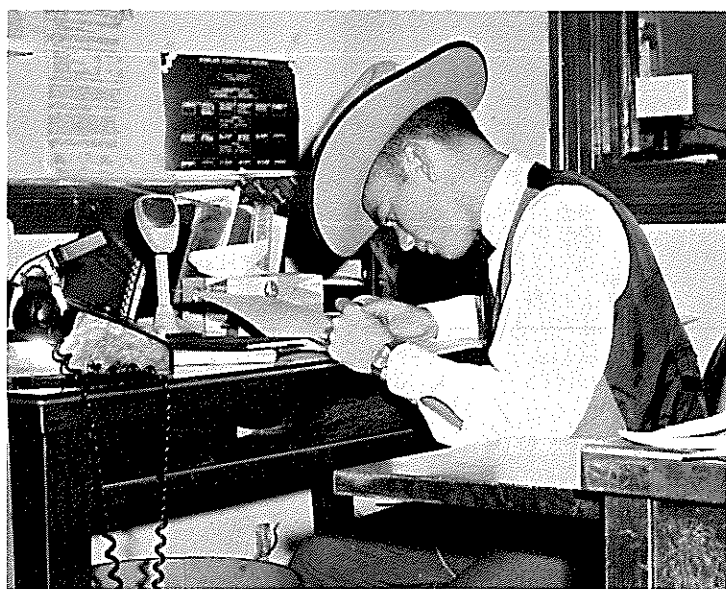
Meredith hides with embarrassment as she gives an answer to the lawyer's question.



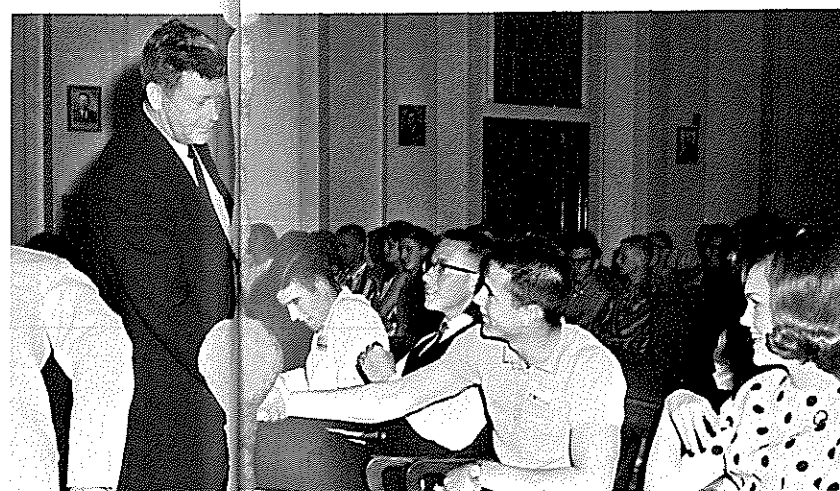
Jury deliberates on evidence.
