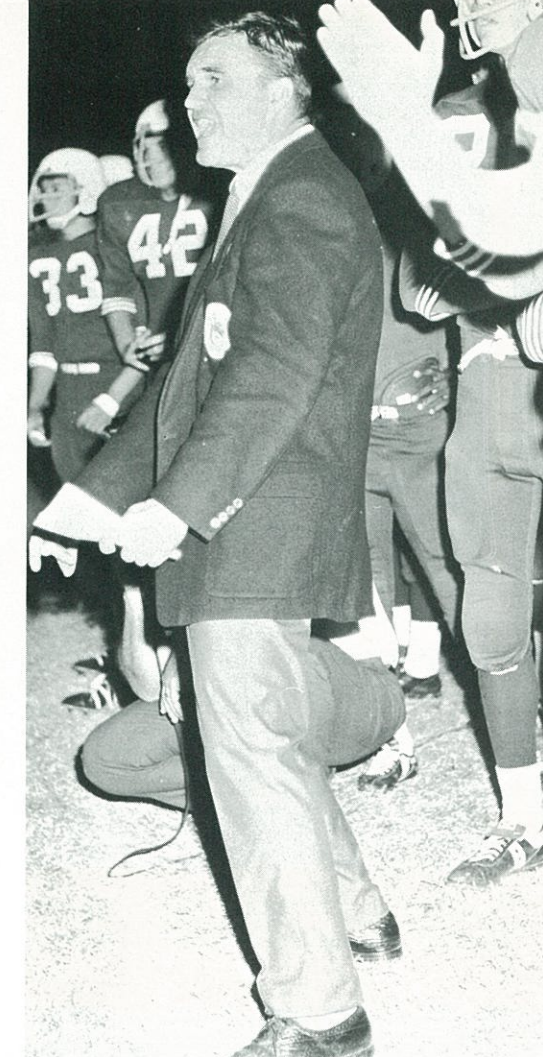
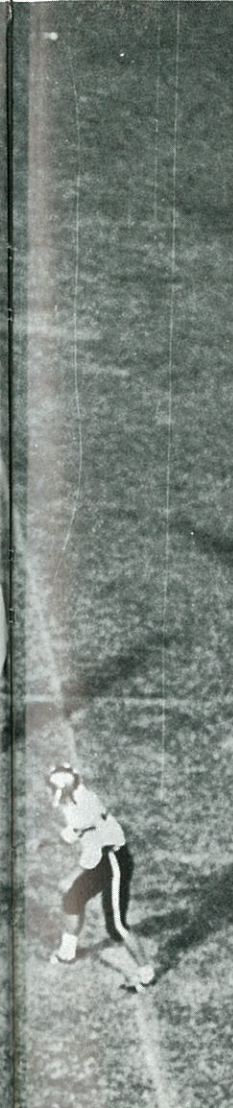
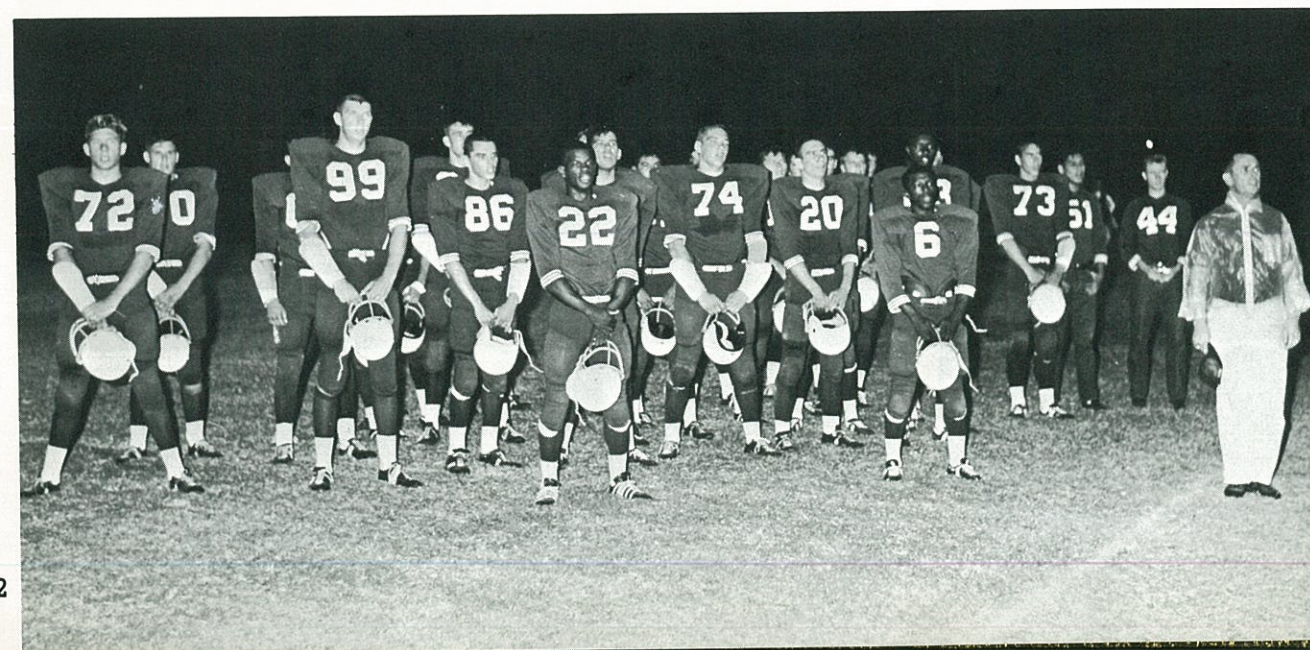


The Yellow Jackets offense starts a drive downfield in their 36-0 victory over the Pecos Eagles.
