

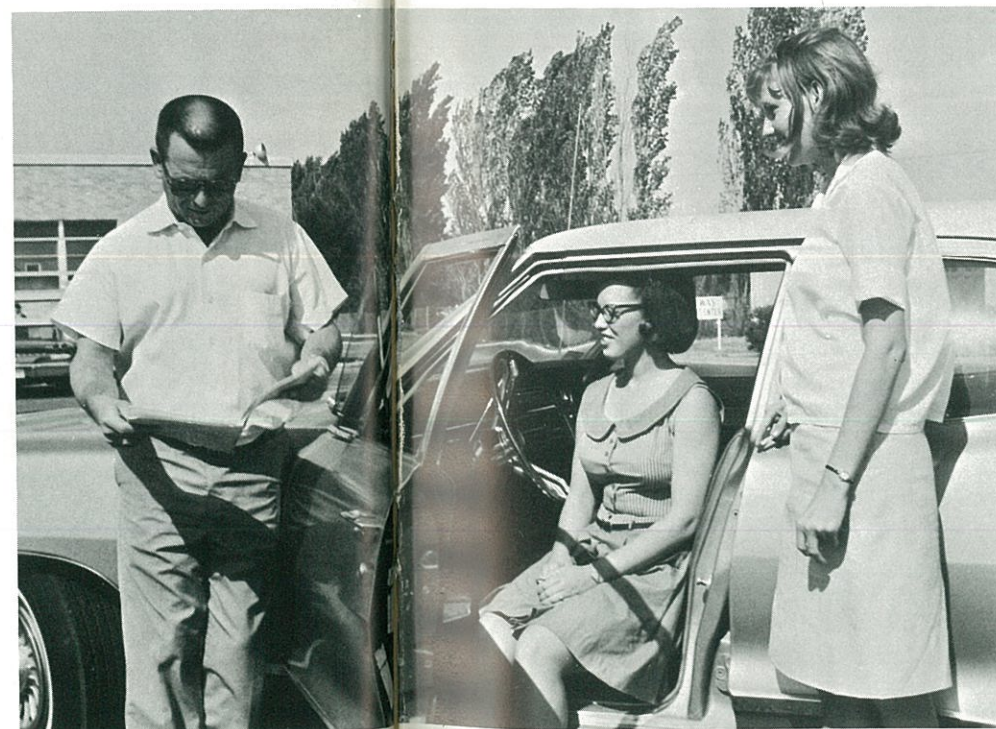

## Art, Social Studies, Drivers Education Add to Curriculum

Art is designed to provide a background for developing an appreciation of art. Sculpture, abstract art, advertising art, designing, and recognition and appreciation of all fine and commercial art are units of study.

The Social Studies offered include World History, American History, Civics, Sociology, and Economics. World History gives the student an understanding of the changing world in which he lives. American History is a study of the nation's economic, social, and political development with emphasis on the period from Reconstruction to the present. Civics includes a study of the structure and function of local, state, and Federal government. Sociology is concerned with the study of people and their basic institutions. Economics is a study of the processes by which people earn a living with the relationships of production, distribution, and consumption of wealth and income.

Drivers Education provides for boys and girls to acquire knowledge, establish attitudes, develop skills, and practice habits which will lead to intelligent traffic behavior.
