Montgomery Represents Kermit in State

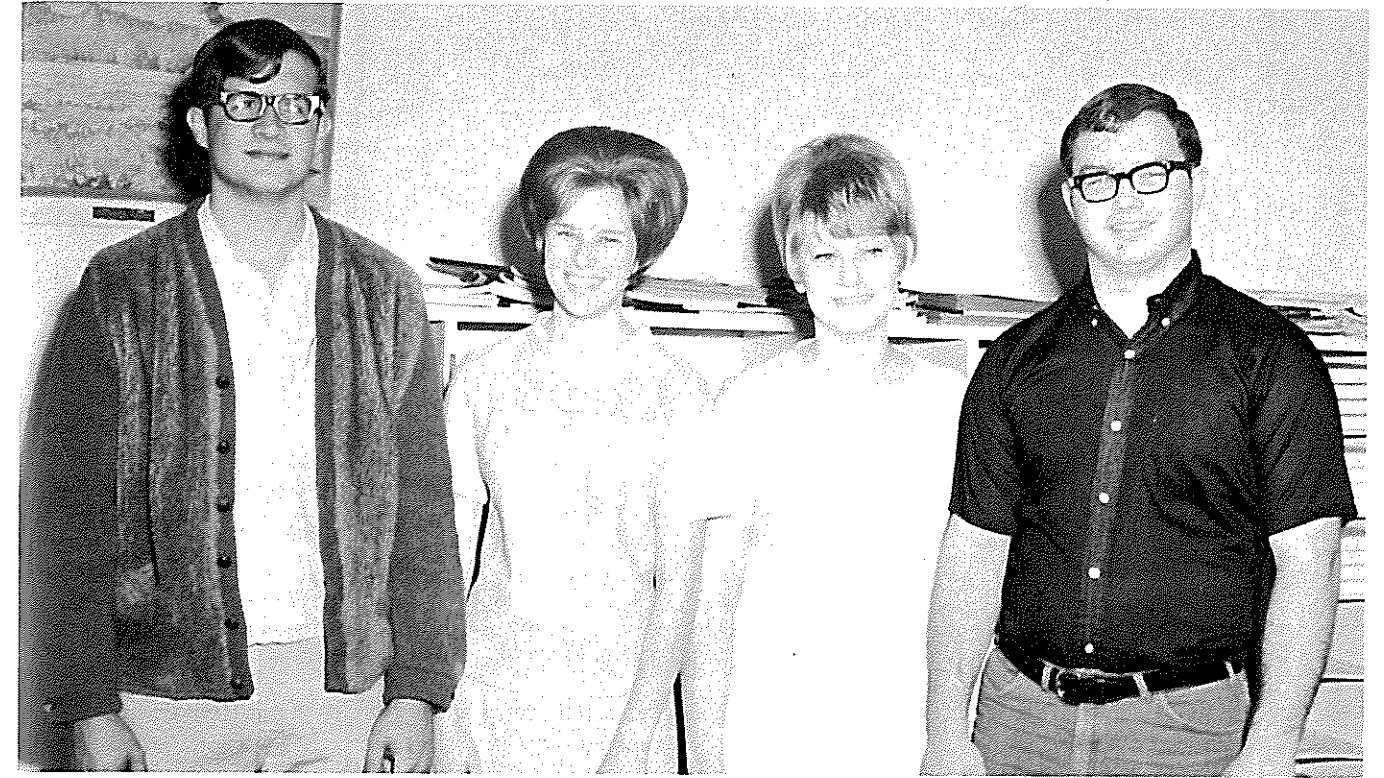

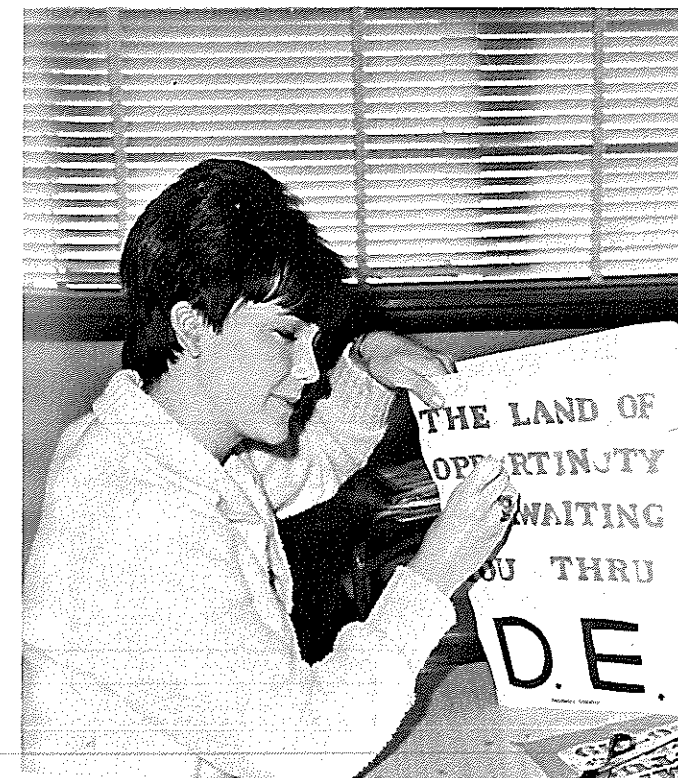
