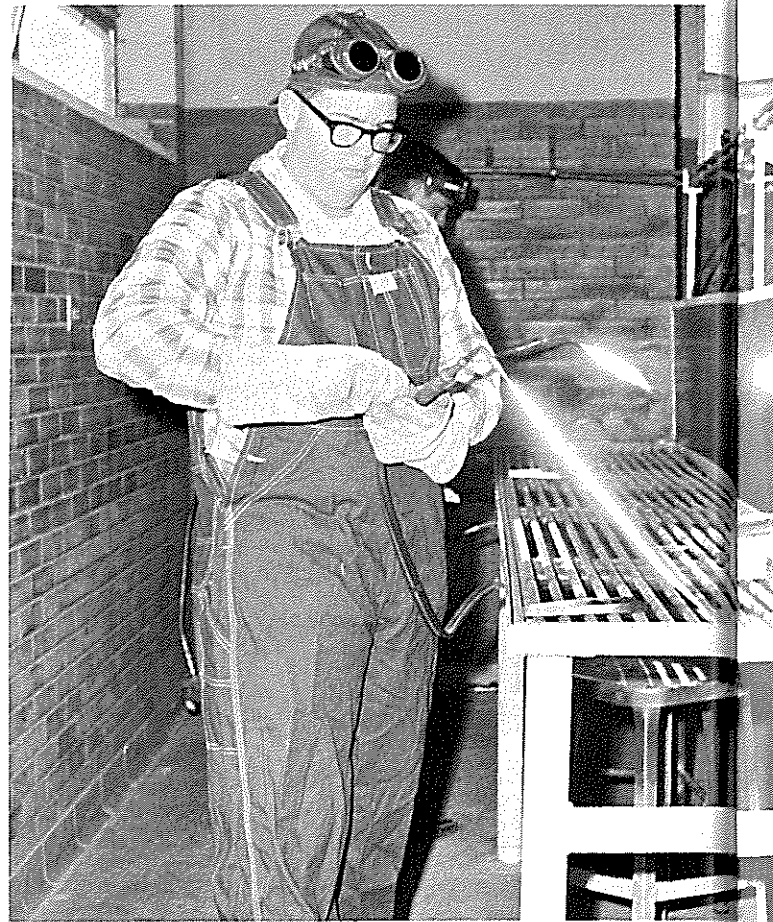


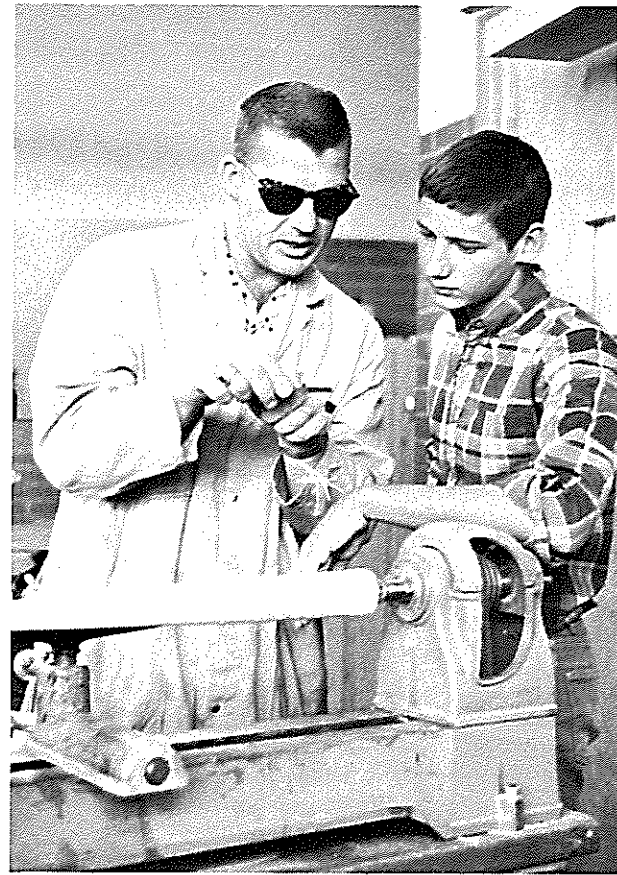
# Industrial Arts, Homemaking Add to Skills

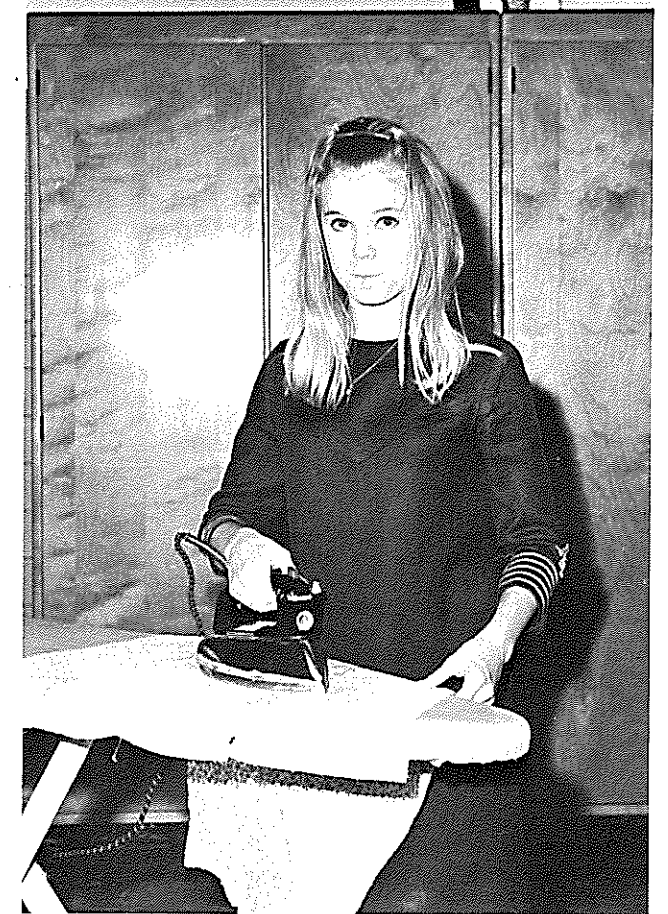

Bobby Miracle is adjusting a blowtorch in welding class.

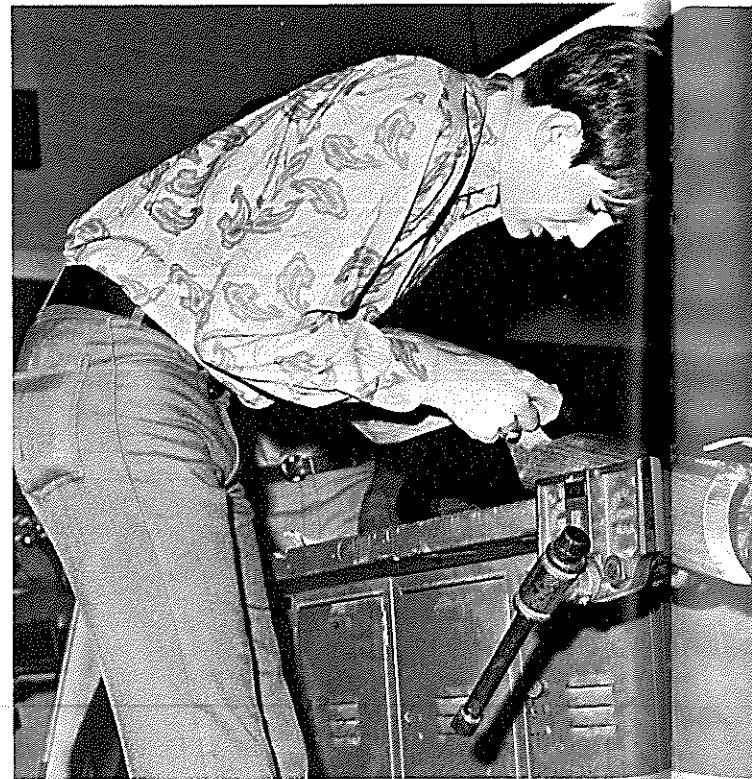


Ronnie Hestand and Mr. Barrs turn a leg on the lathe in shop.
