The Greatest Man Alive

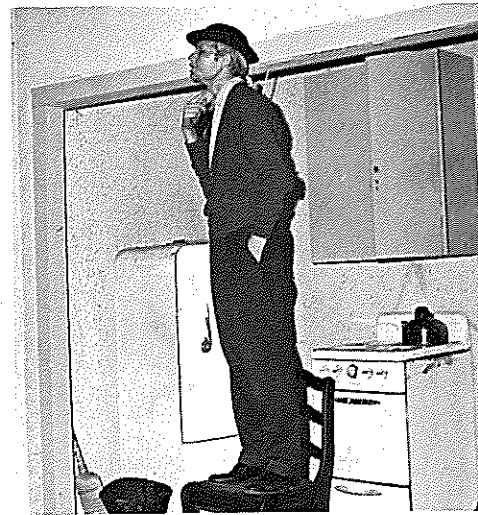

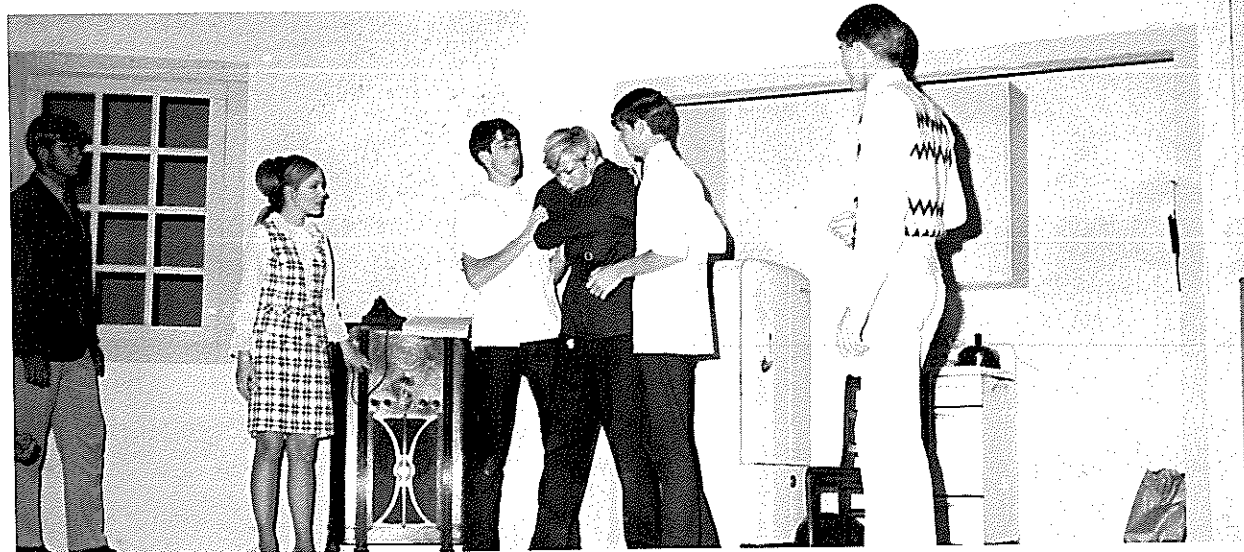
David Nash tries to stop Amos from committing suicide.



Mike Stidham (Amos) and Joe Driver (Tom) read the paper to see how Amos can get his name in it.



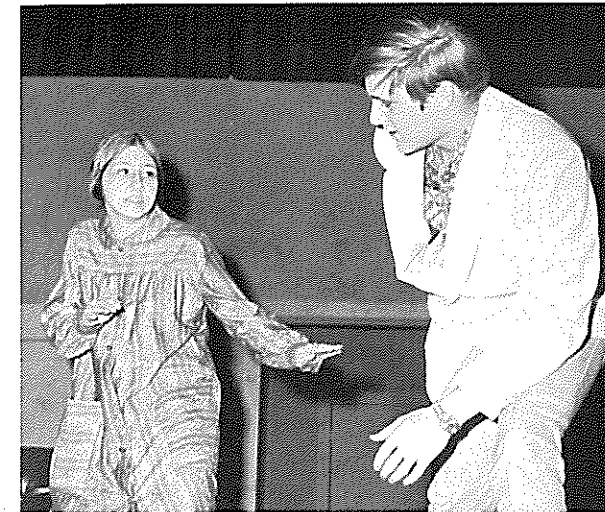
Will hanging himself get his name in the paper?



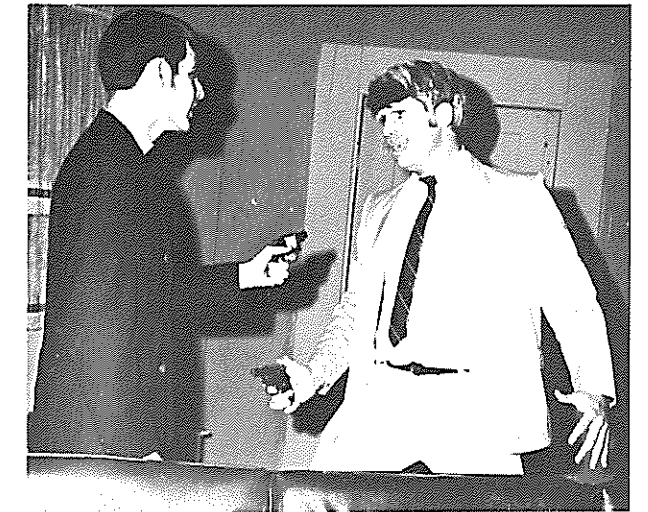
Amos is carried away in a straight-jacket after failing to hang himself.

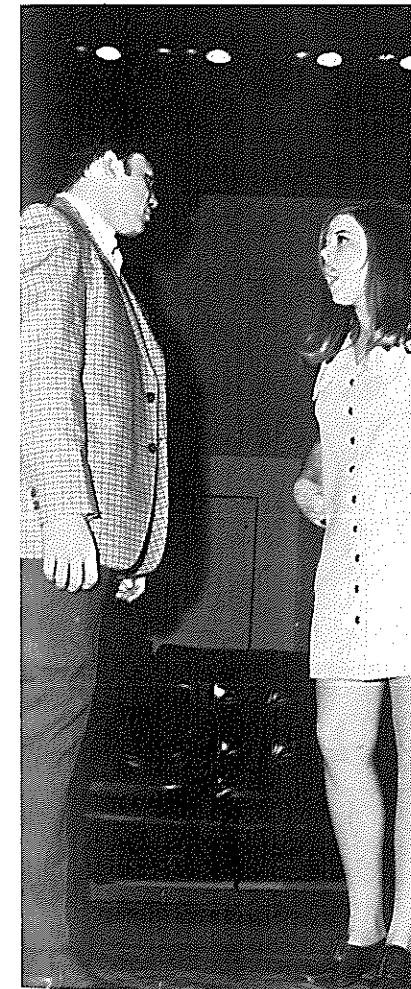

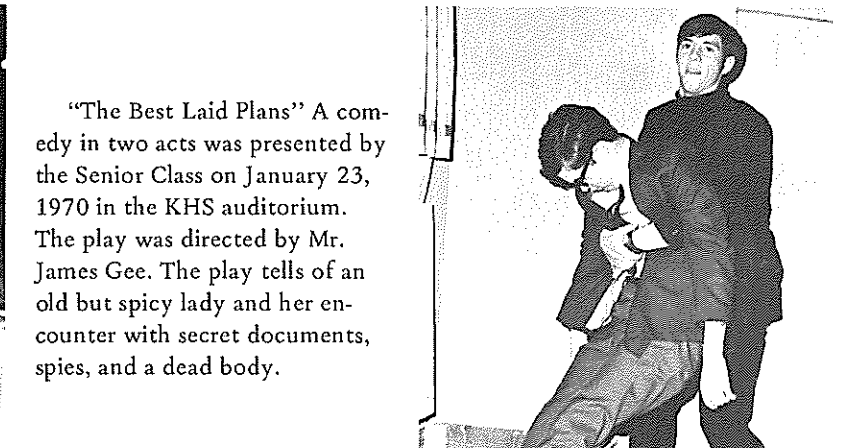
Kandy Scholl (Ada) uses her karate on Kary Duncan, who portrays a spy.



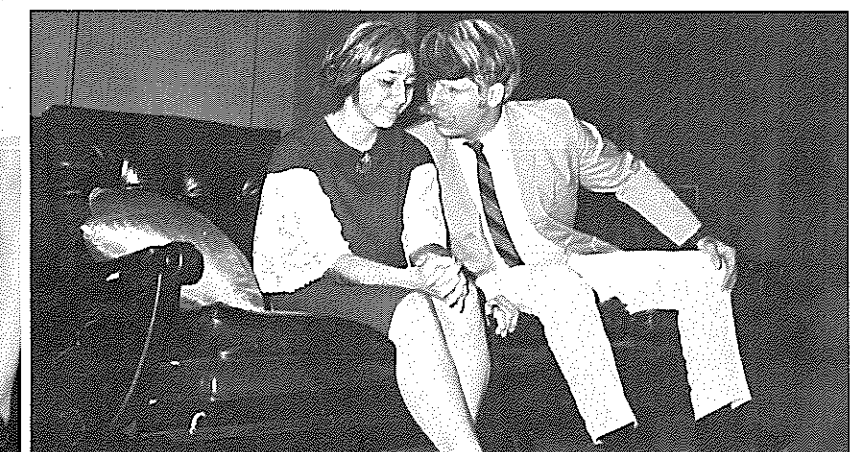
Rodney King and Gary Greenwood seem to be disagreeing.
