Using the theme, "God Has a Plan, a Purpose and a Will For Your Life," Baylor Football Coach Grant Teaff made an inspiring talk to some 300 in attendance at the Kermit Grid Banquet Monday night at the Community Center.

Teaff, one of the most sought-after speakers in the state, recited some moving experiences in his life and told of personal contacts with athletes who set themselves a goal and stuck with it.

Stressing that life is not all peaches and cream, he said young men and coaches need to share things. He commented that it hurts to lose, then told what it takes to be a winner.

"You do not become a winner by association and you do not become a loser by association," he said. "It depends on you as an individual to be a winner. You need to build goals. Set your goals realistically and work to attain them. Set your goals high, but be realistic."

The young coach told the athletes present that they should never give up, overcome their obstacles, overcome defeat and understand that God has a plan, a purpose and a will for your life.
