The Yellow Jacket offense racked up a total of 302 yards to lead Kermit to its third straight win of the season with a victory over the Lovington Wildcats. The Jackets defeated the 'Cats 33-7.

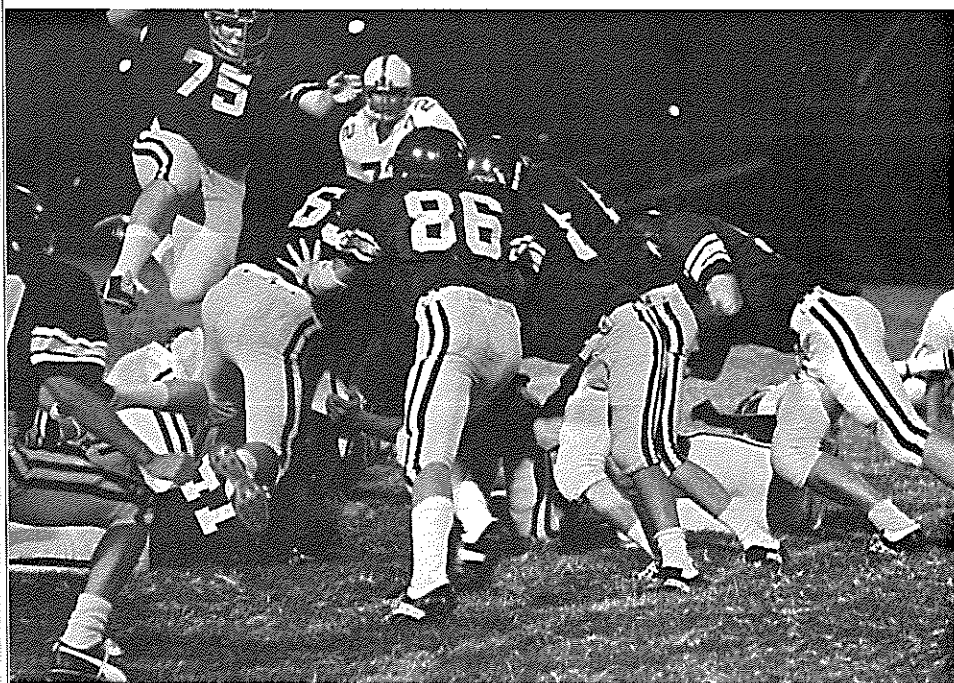
The Jackets scored twice in each of the first two quarters and held the 'Cats to one lone TD to take a 27-7 halftime lead.

Alfred McGilbra raced 26 yards for the first KHS score. Les Baucom snagged a Scott Edwards pass for the second TD. Baucom added each PAT.

McGilbra raced 13 yards in the second period to tally again and Ray Jennings recovered a Wildcat fumble in their endzone for the fourth TD. Again Baucom's PATs were good.

The score remained stable until TB Clifford Holt capped a 45 yard drive with his first tally of the season.

Panthers Defeat Yellow Jackets, 34-14

After three straight wins, the Kermit Yellow Jackets were handed their first loss of the 1977 season by the Ft. Stockton Panthers on Sept. 22 in Kermit.

The Jackets out-gained the Panthers in the rushing category 177 yards to 175, but the Panthers completed 9 of the 15 passes for 212 yards including 2 TD's for a 34-14 victory.

The score, however, was not exactly an indication of the way the game was played. The Panthers were able to cash in on 4 Jacket turnovers for 24 quick points.

Jackets Fall Before Loboes, 28-0
