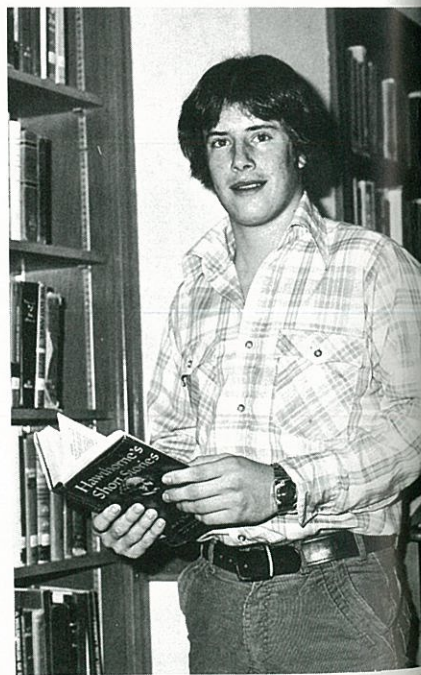
Members of the Senior Class elected Patty Wood and Dale McCombs as class favorites.
