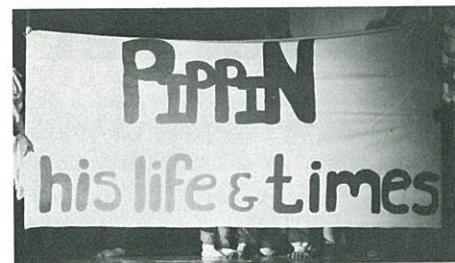


All-School Presents

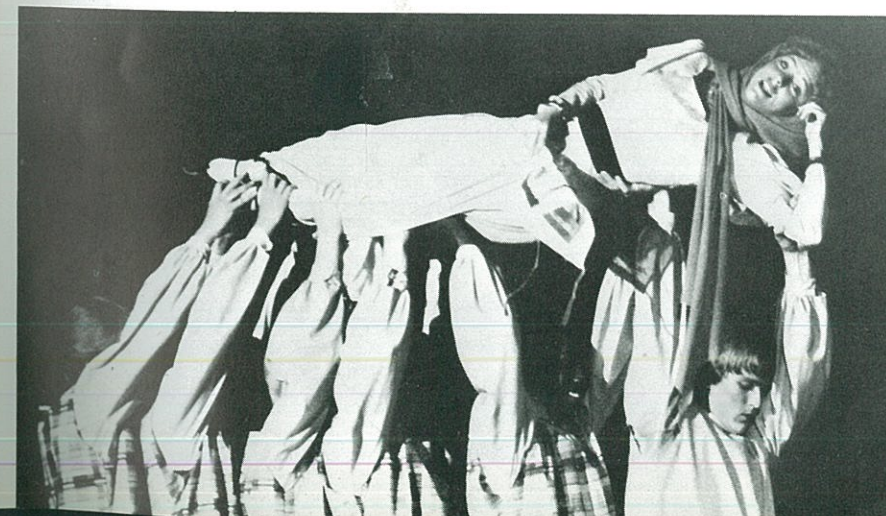
