
Kermit's first score came as QB Agmed Ramirez carried the pigskin into the endzone for the TD. Sergio Lujan booted the extra point.

Tom Carrasco scored the final TD of the game from three yards out.



Jerry Pendergrass blocked a Wildcat punt and Kris Crawford recovered a fumble.


Overall, the Kermit unit had 277 yards and 16 first downs, while the Wildcats gained 92 yards and five first downs.




Jacket quarterback Agmed Ramirez successfully mixed offensive plays and then scored himself.





KHS Stings Rebels, Eagles & 'Cats




Cornerback Coby Owen (27) blocks a Midland Lee JV punt as the KHS crew totally devistated the visiting Rebels 36-0.
