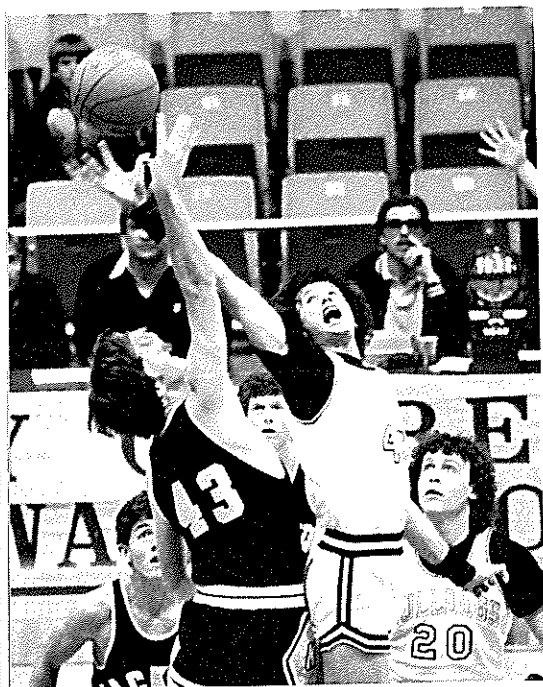

**Jacket Cagers Edge Wolves, Lose To Clyde**



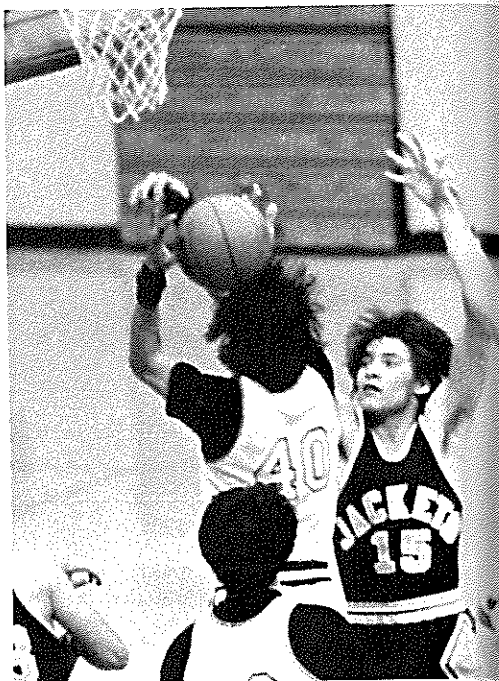
KHS post Lynn Fisher goes high in the air to get the opening tip-off as the Yellow Jackets challenged the Clyde Bulldogs for a Region I berth.

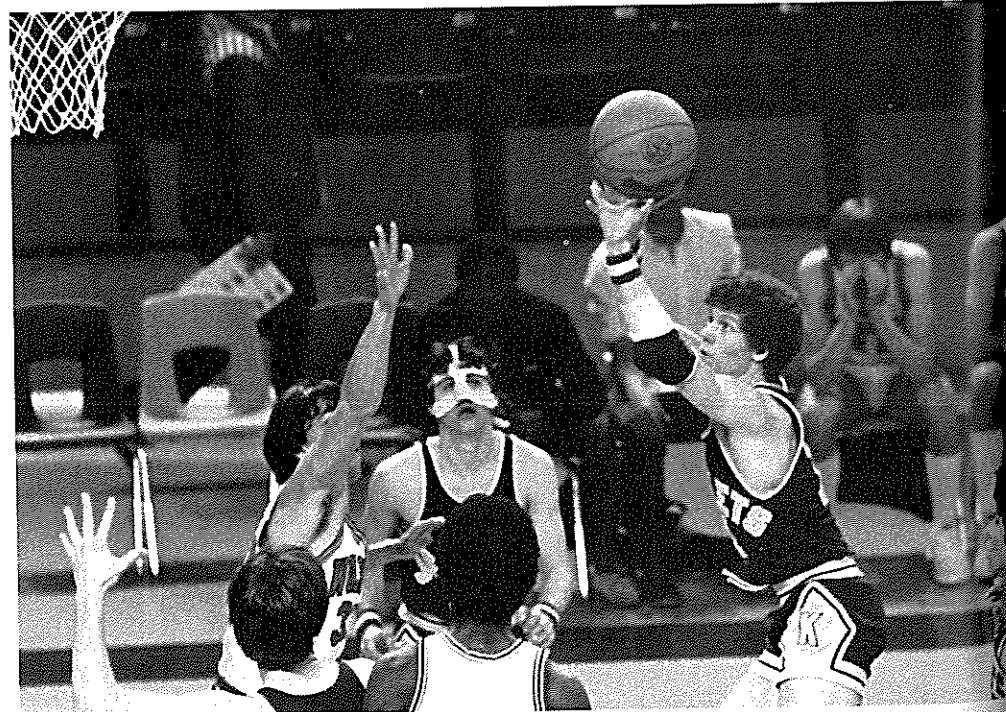

The KHS cagers were unable to contain the Clyde squad in the second half and the Bulldogs came from behind to win 62-61.

The Jackets took an 8-2 first quarter lead and then led 35-28 at halftime. A cold third period settled on the Kermit squad and Clyde then held a 52-47 third period lead. Mid-way through the final quarter Kermit tied Clyde — but couldn't hold on.

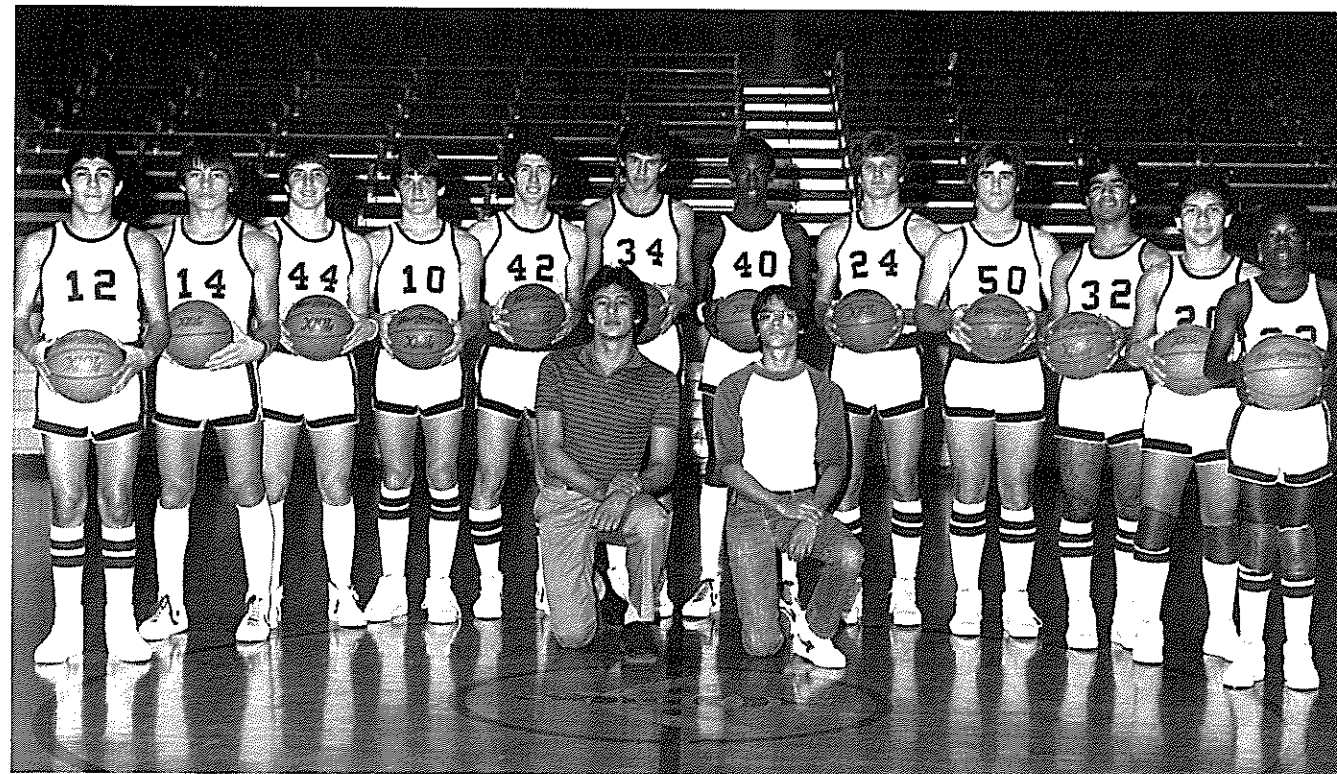


Kermit's Mike Muniz blocks a shot from a Colorado City Wolf.

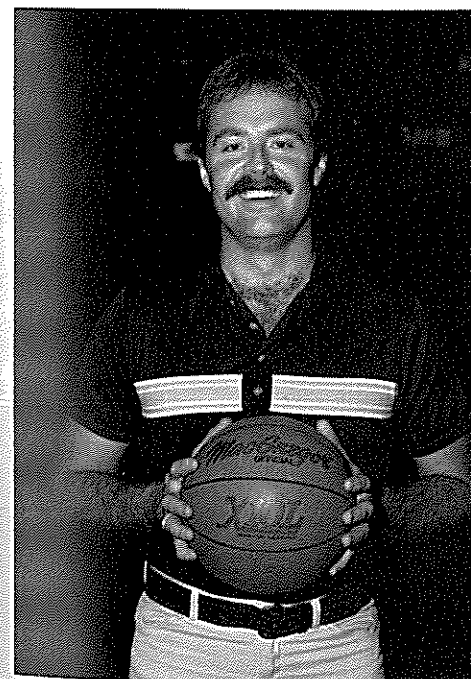


KHS guard Chuck Moore puts up a two-pointer against the Colorado City Wolves in Bi-District play.

**JV Basketball Crew Collects Victories**

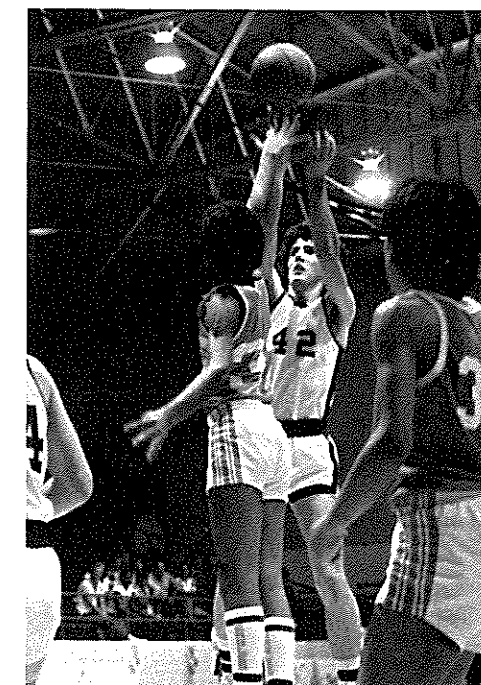
