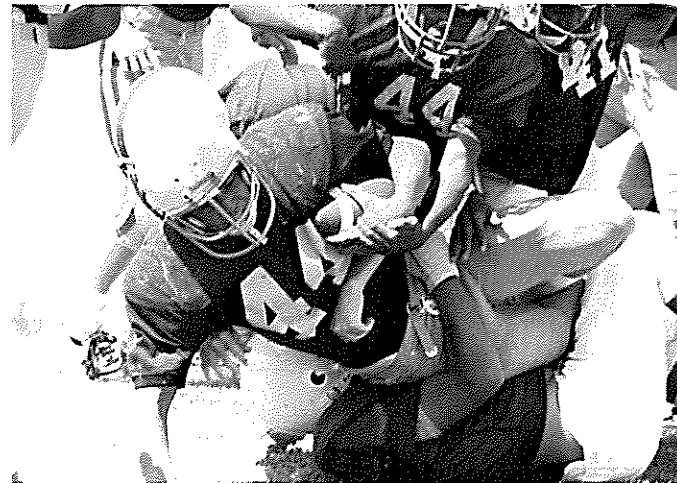


Daubers Post 6-1-2 Gridiron Record

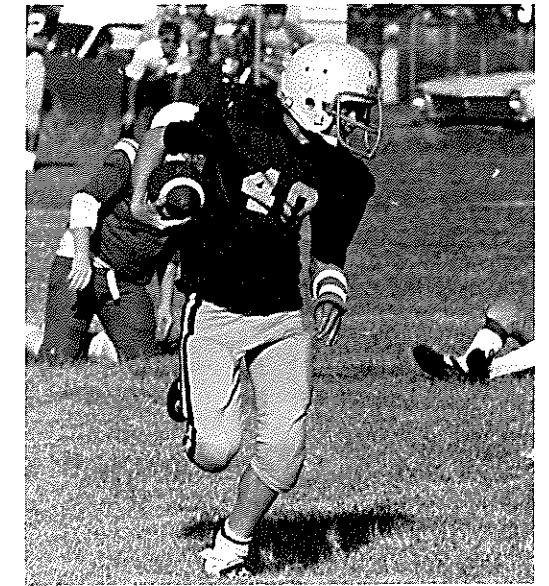


Fullback Marc Parks struggles for first down yardage as the Daubers rip through the Pecos Little Eagle defense.

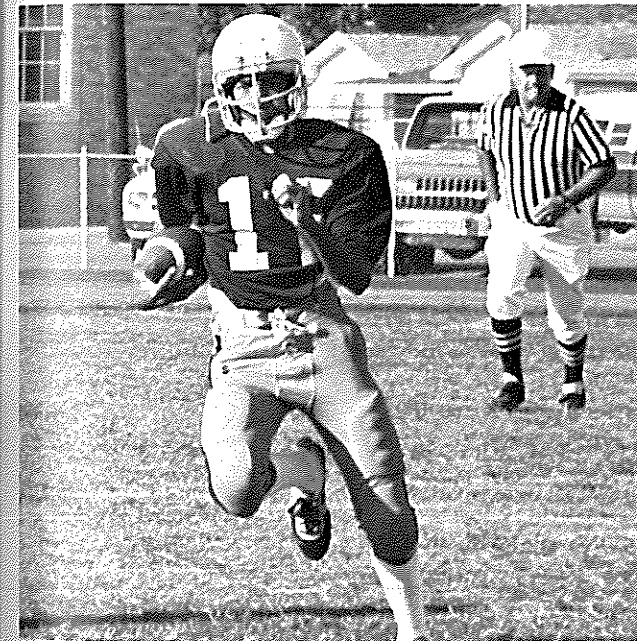
Carrying the pigskin for another good KJHS gain is runningback Armando Rivera.



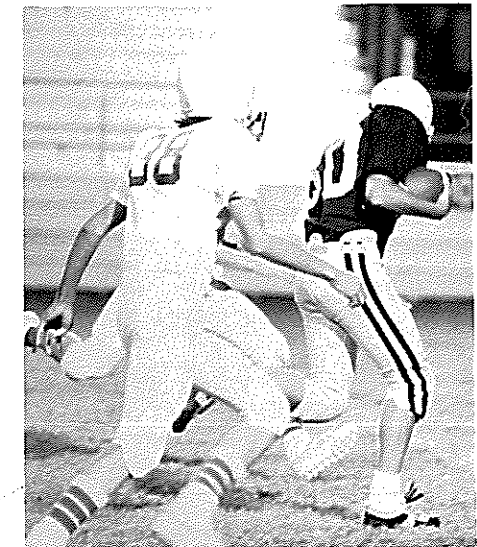

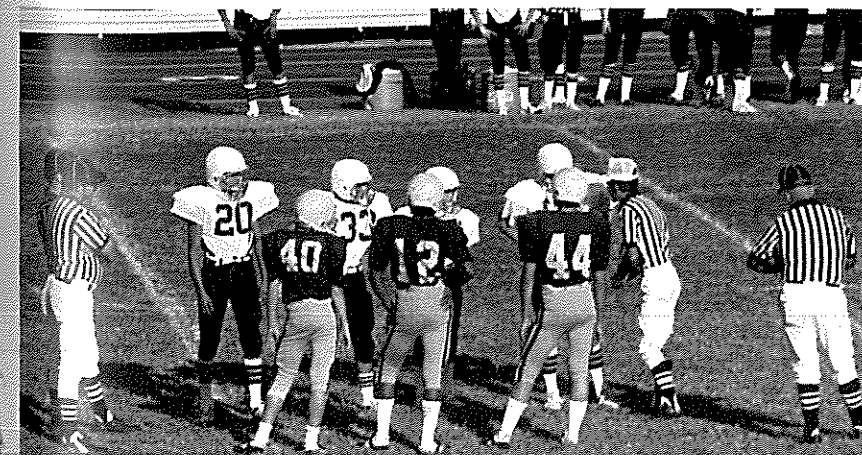
Gaining more than first down yardage for the KJHS Dauber squad is halfback Phil Todd.
