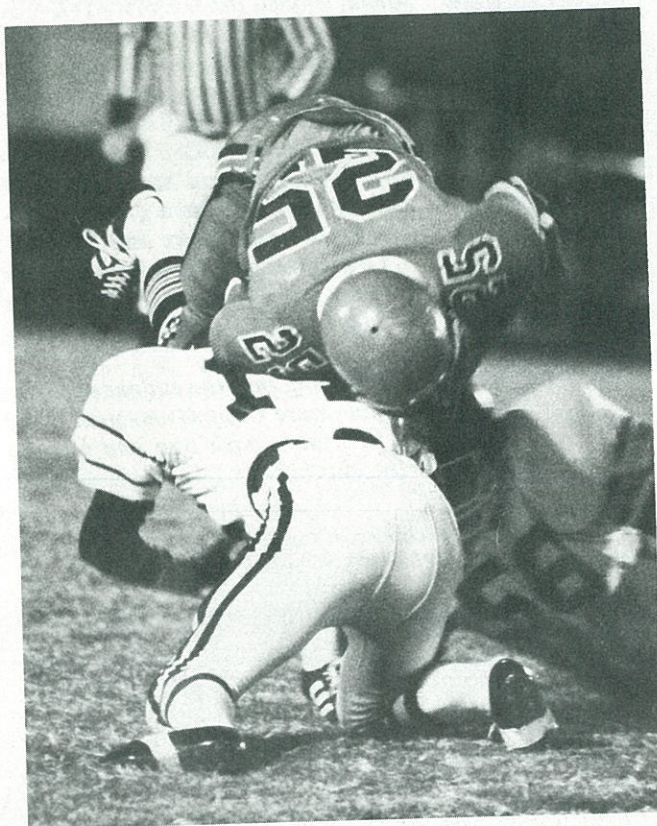


## Jackets' 66-7 Score Sets Record For Homecoming

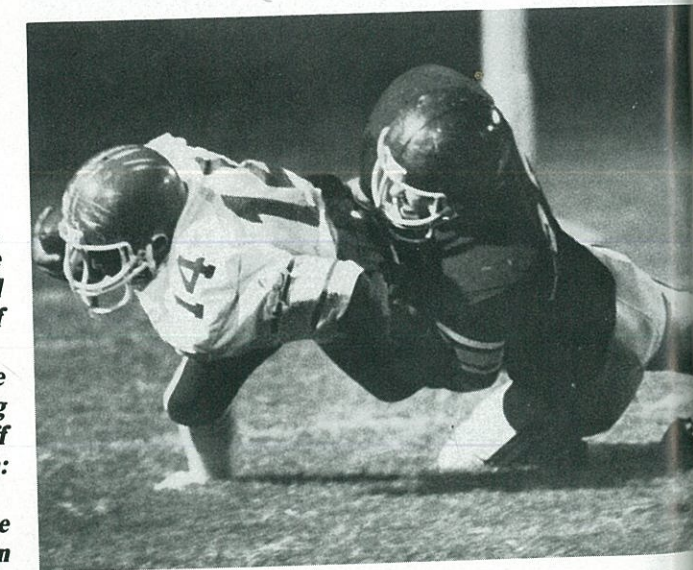


KHS defenders Mike Muniz and Ruben Towns team-up to put the brakes on this Seagraves runningback. The Jackets won 29-8.

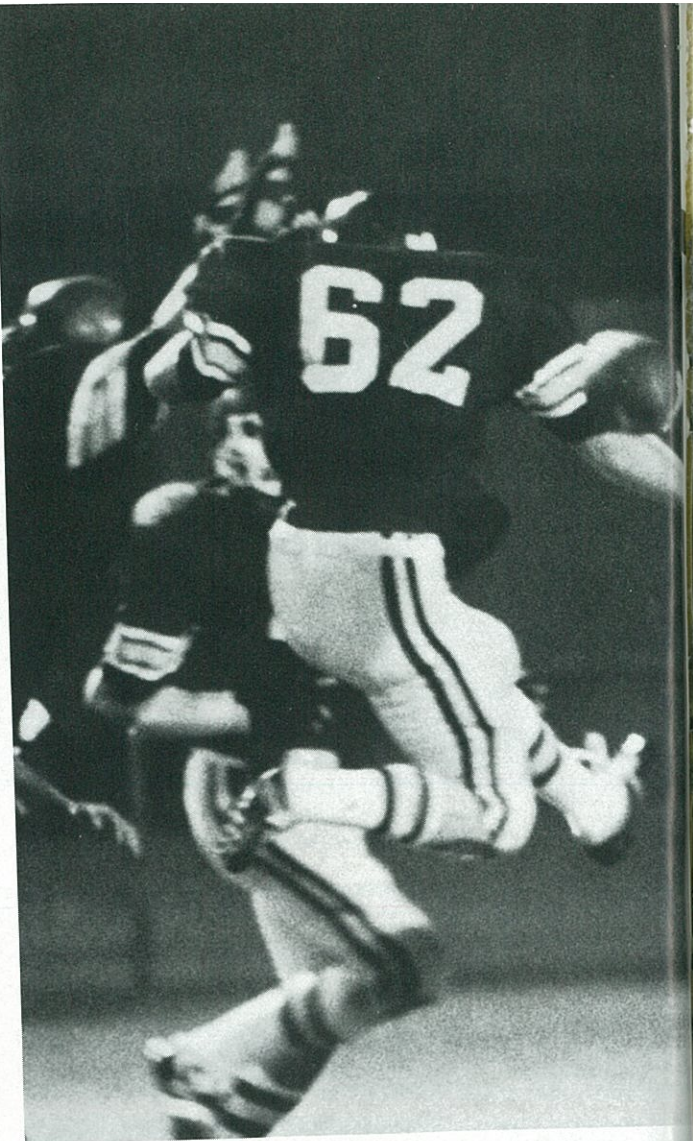
The KHS squad continued to win, week after week, no matter what the sports commentators said. When the Jackets met the Seagraves Eagles, the maroon-and-gold unit won 29-8 behind the scoring of Muniz, Lang Bolf and Orozco.

One week later the Kermit bunch won again, this time at Homecoming against the visiting Cathedral Fighting Irish: Kermit took command from the opening kick-off and proceeded to totally dominate the visiting Irish: Kermit 66 — Cathedral 7.

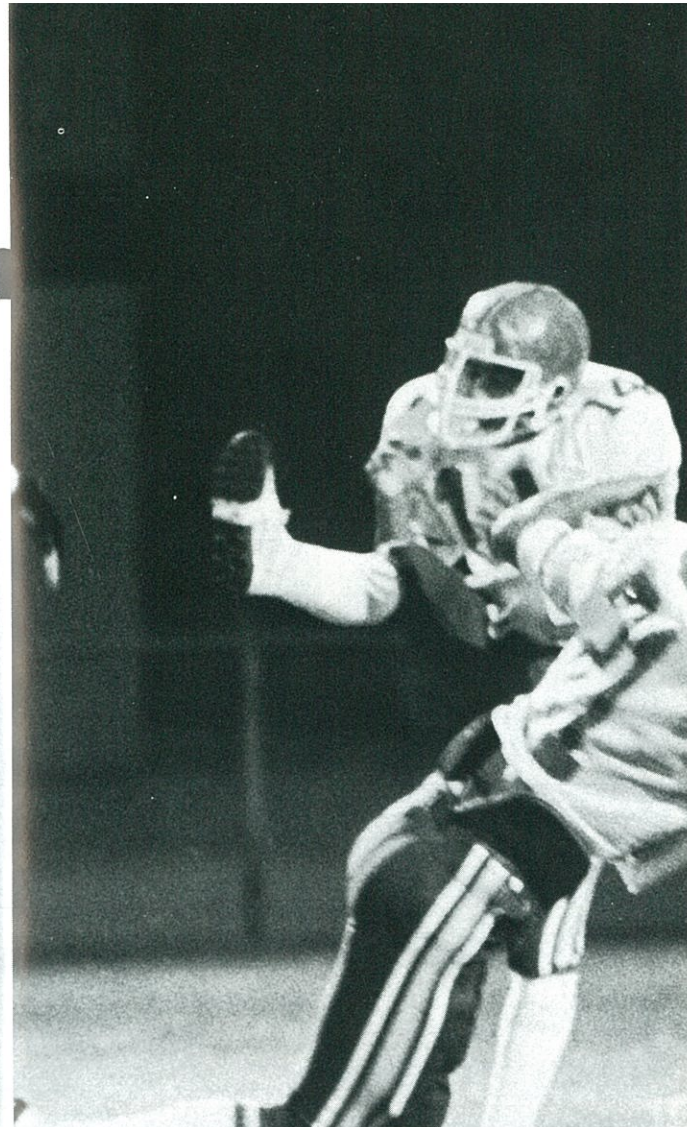
Kermit tallied two TD's in the first quarter, four more in the second period, two in the third and one more in the fourth. The Jackets rushed for a total of 585 yards. Ramirez was the leading rusher with 174 yards, Muniz added 75, Orozco tacked on 94, Martin Alarcon added 60 and Robert Aguilar gained 37.
