Beginning in 1977, the KHS Student Council began a tradition — one that continues through 1986: the KHS High School Bowl.




Many times the seniors have won top honors, but as often as not, the junior class managed to win.

The sophomores and freshmen haven't been named champions yet, but they still give the upperclassmen a run for their money.


The High School Bowl occurs twice each year. The first bowl contest takes place during American Education Week and the second contest takes place during Texas Public School Week.
