Located in the heart of the great oil-producing Permian Basin, the petroleum industry plays another major role in the individual lives of all KHS students.

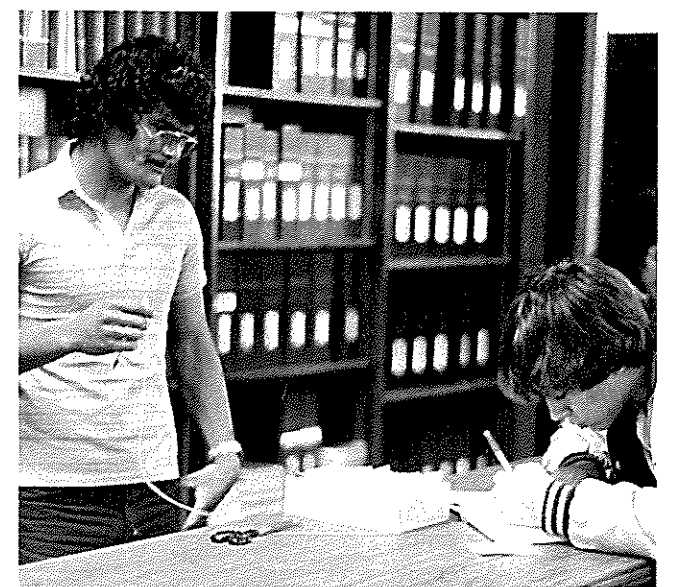
