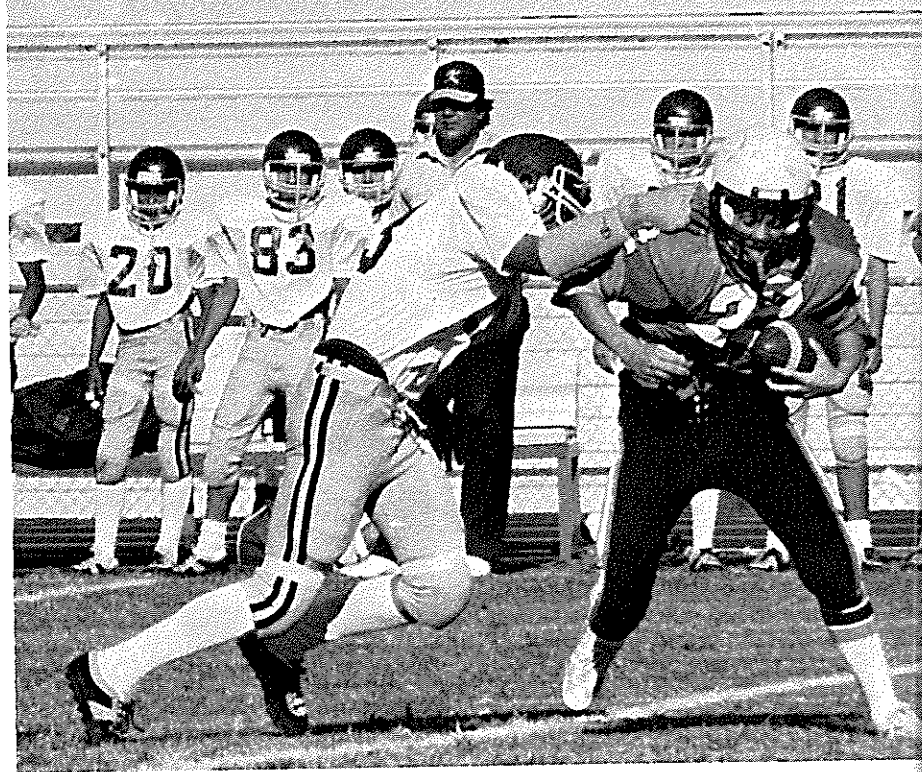


Freshmen Record 7-1 Season

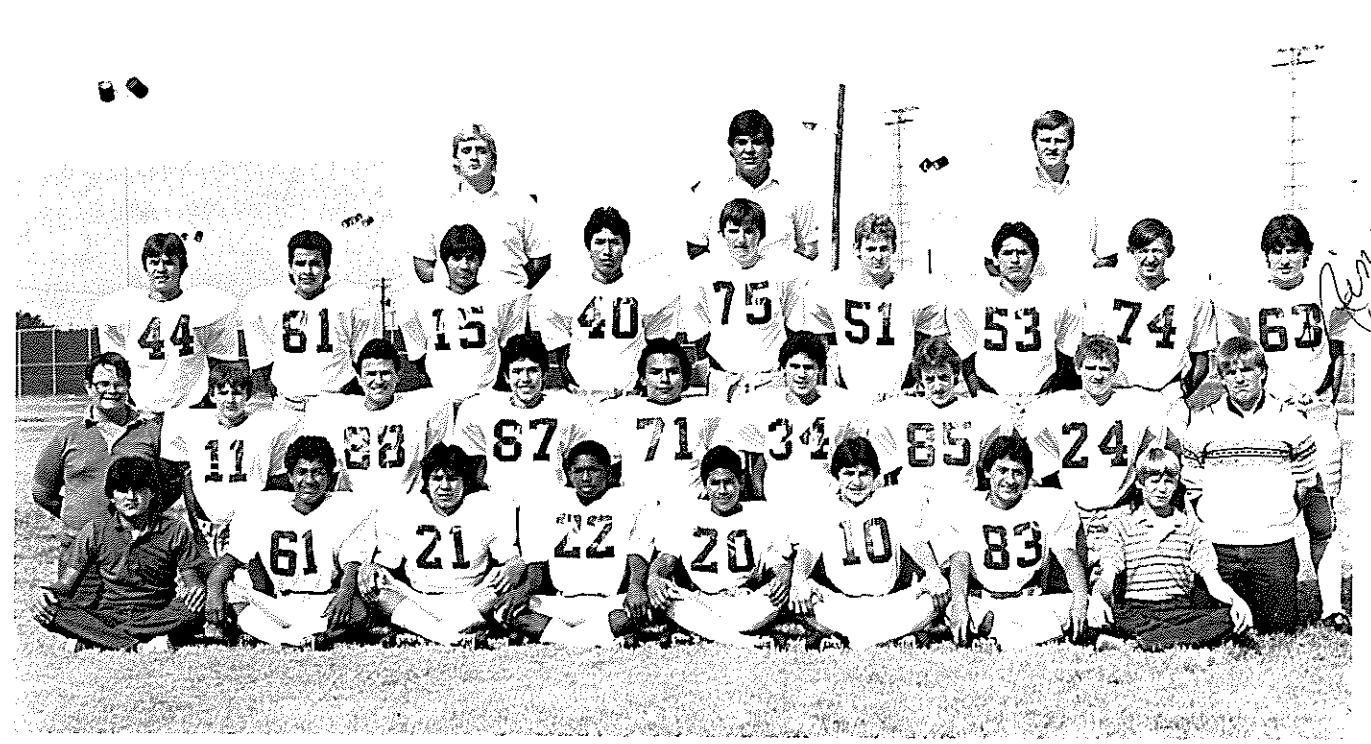
From the first game of the 1985-86 Freshman gridiron season, the Jackets worked as a team. Their skills steadily improved throughout the season and there was never a lack of intensity.
