

9th Jackets Post 13-4 Cage Record

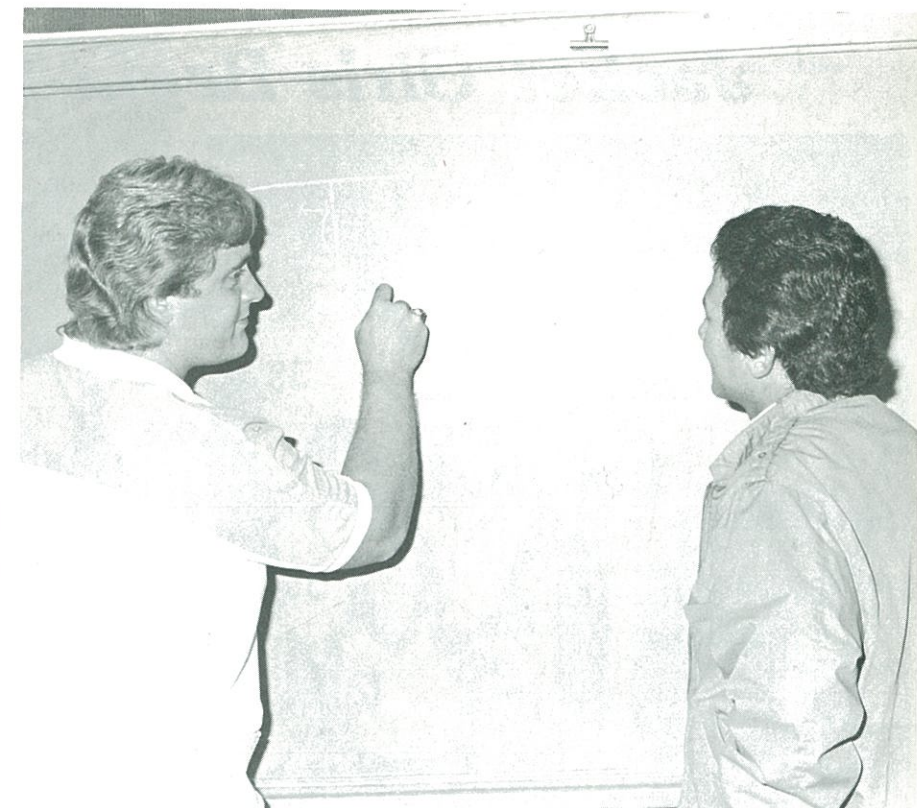
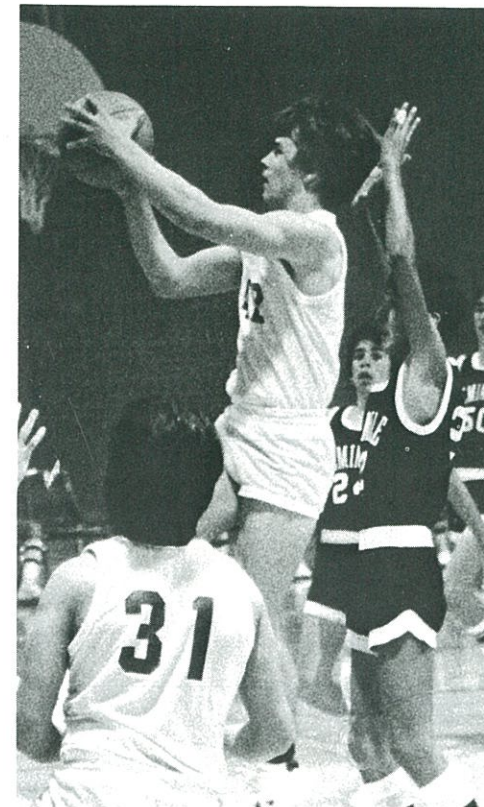

Trying to help the team along with two or more points is Marc Parks.

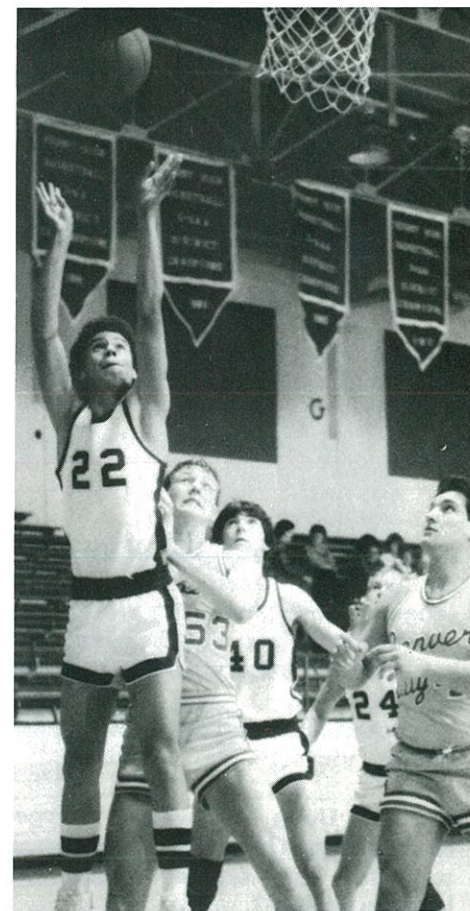
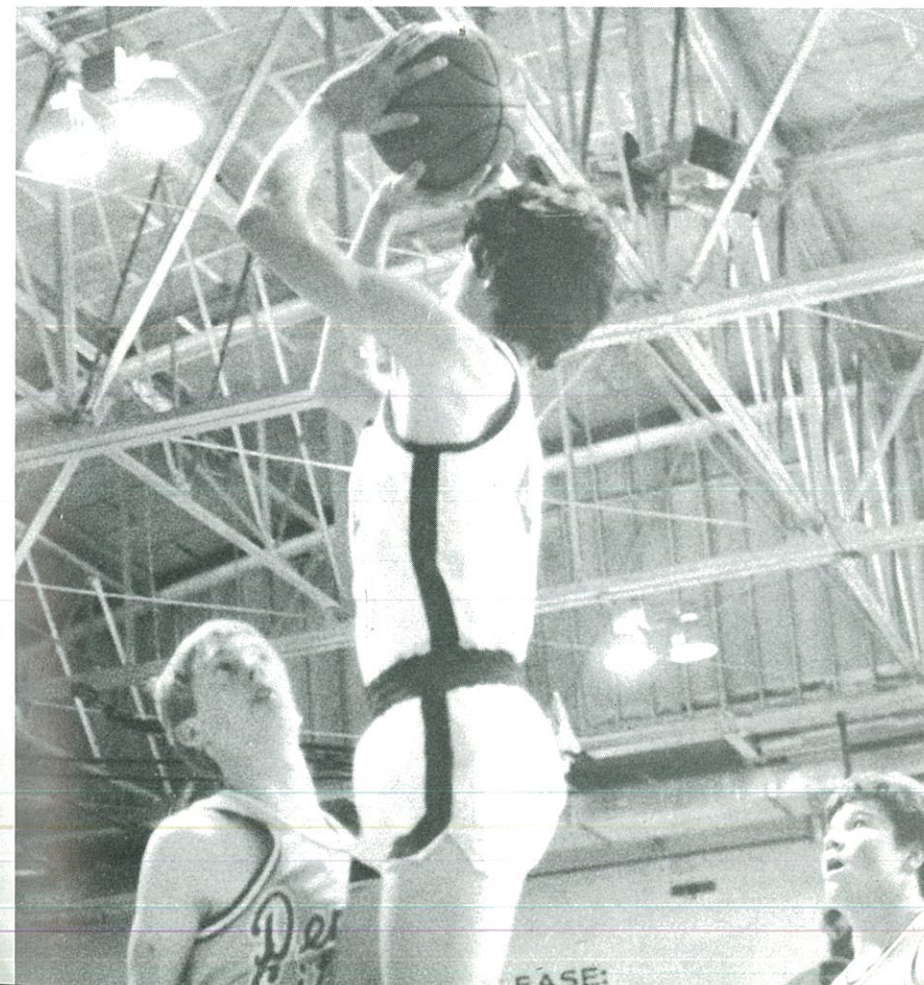


Showing Hector Lopez a strategy play for a sure win in an upcoming game is Coach David Carr.
