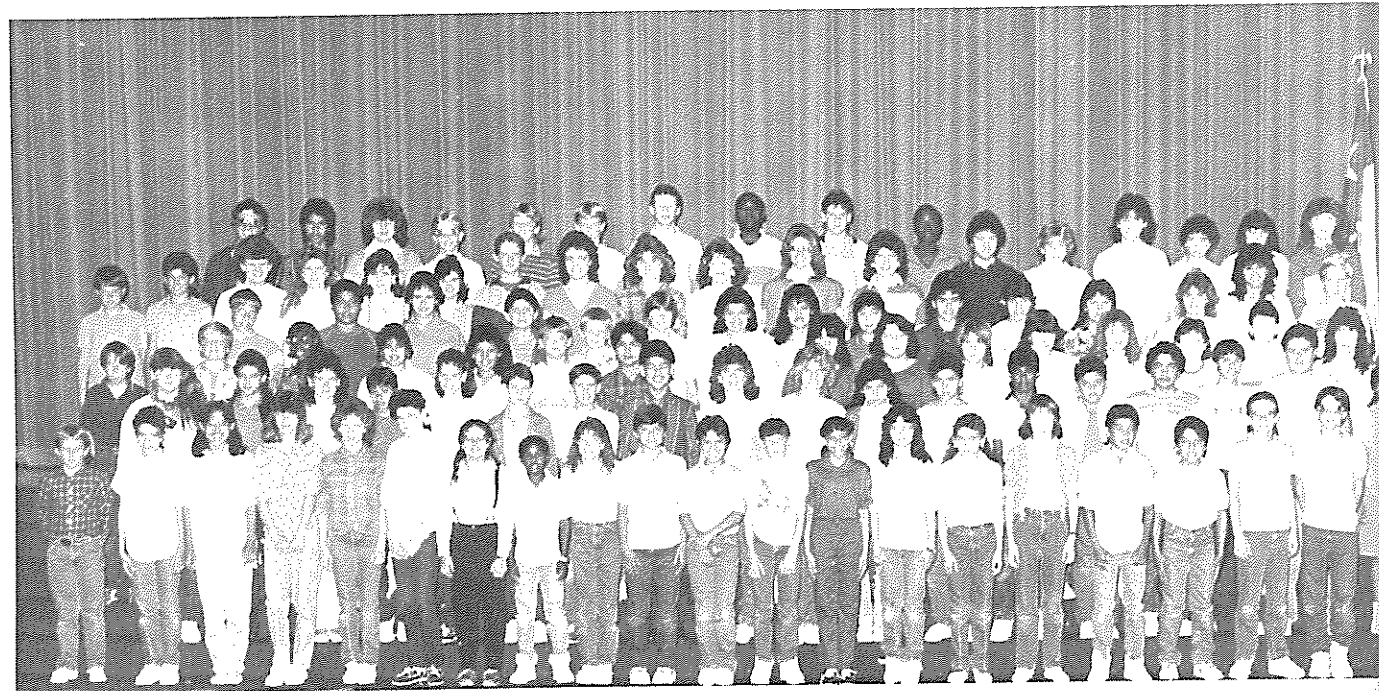


## KJHS Inducts Honor Students

Rosa Flores was chosen as the best dancer at the prom. As a reward, she won the latest Bangles album.

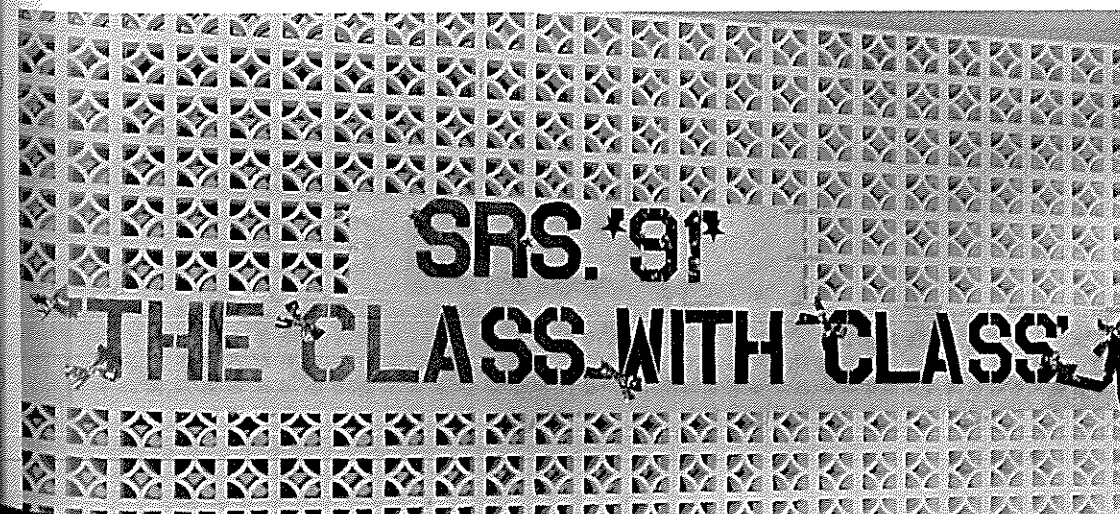
Dancing the night away and never giving up an opportunity to slow dance were Angel Shaffer and Timothy Bowden.
