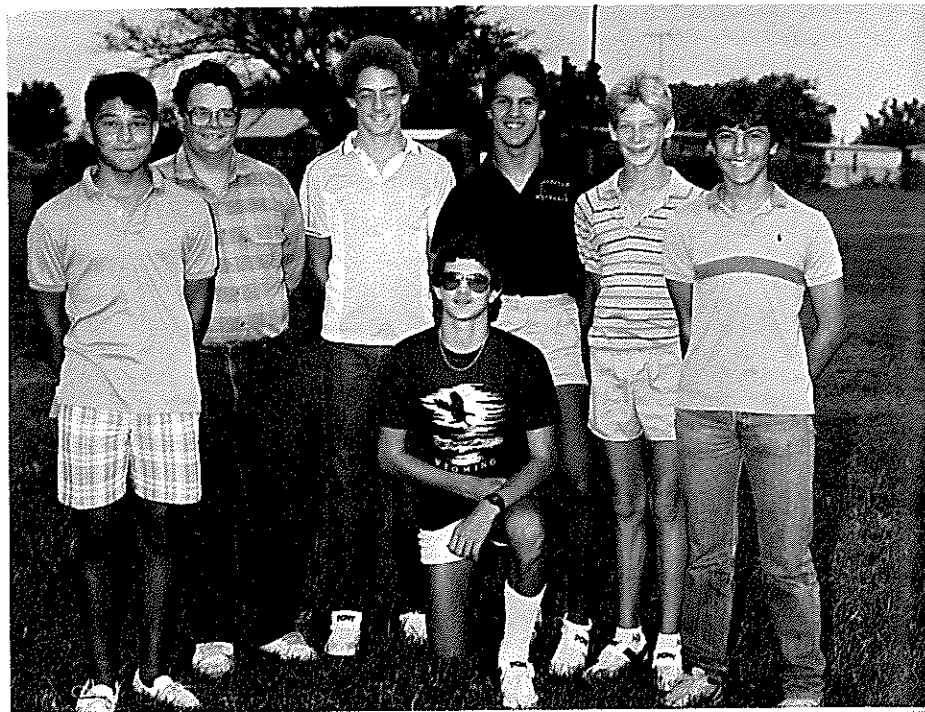


The first victim of the Jackets' sting was the Cathedral Fighting Irish, who the Jackets handed a 48-0 defeat. The sting continued as district play began.

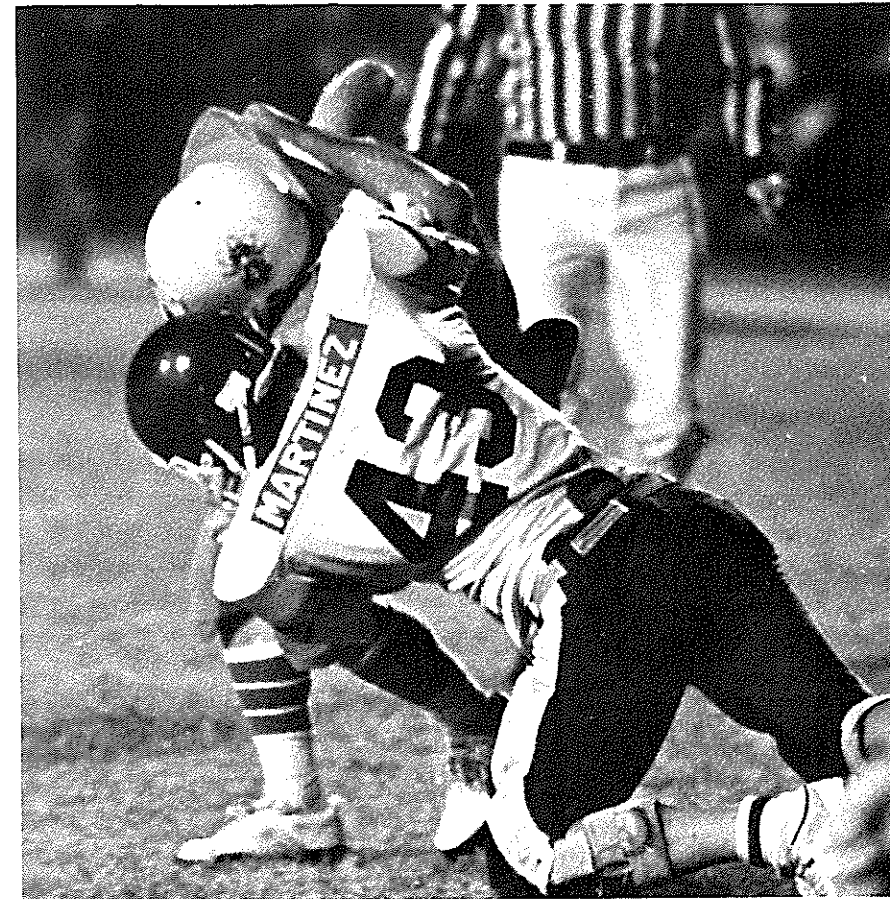
