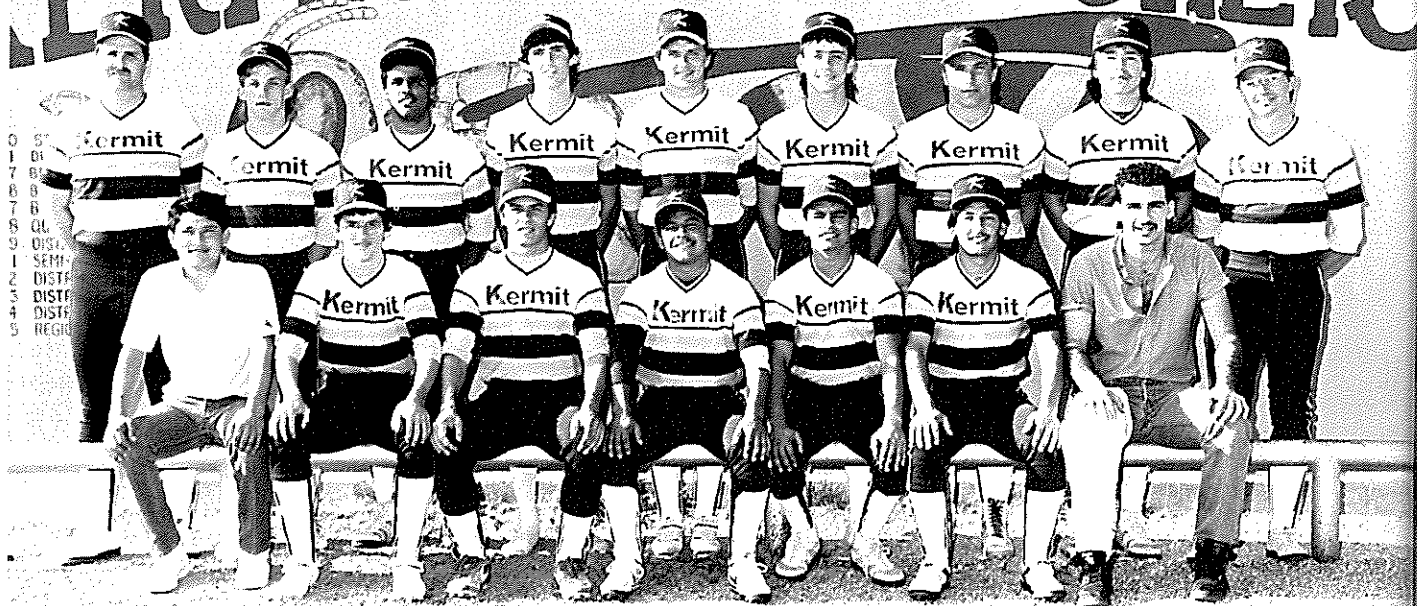


KHS Sluggers Win Area Title

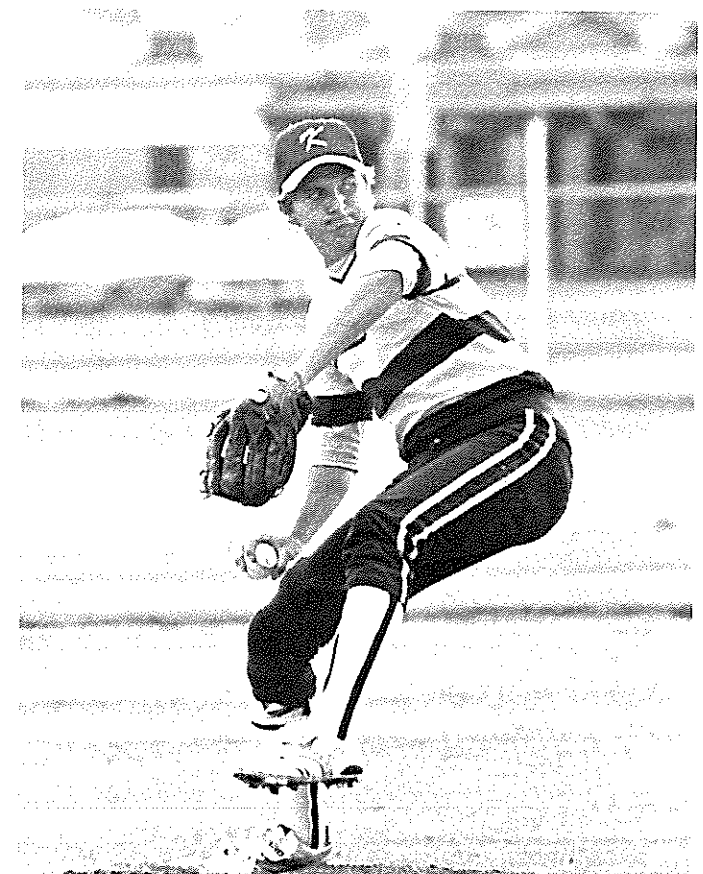
KHS lead-off man Mike Marshall takes his lead off of third base and proceeds to show the Iowa Park squad how to run bases.
