

# JV Jackets Play Blistering Schedule

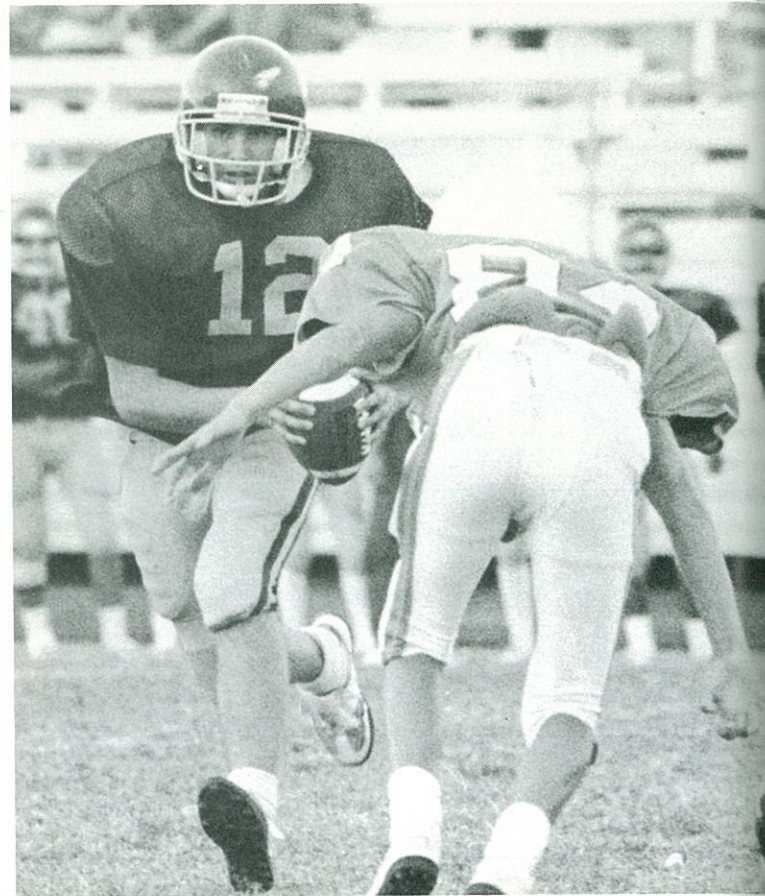

The 1987 season opened with a scrimmage against the AAAA Ft. Stockton Panthers and Kermit out-scored Stockton three touchdowns to two.

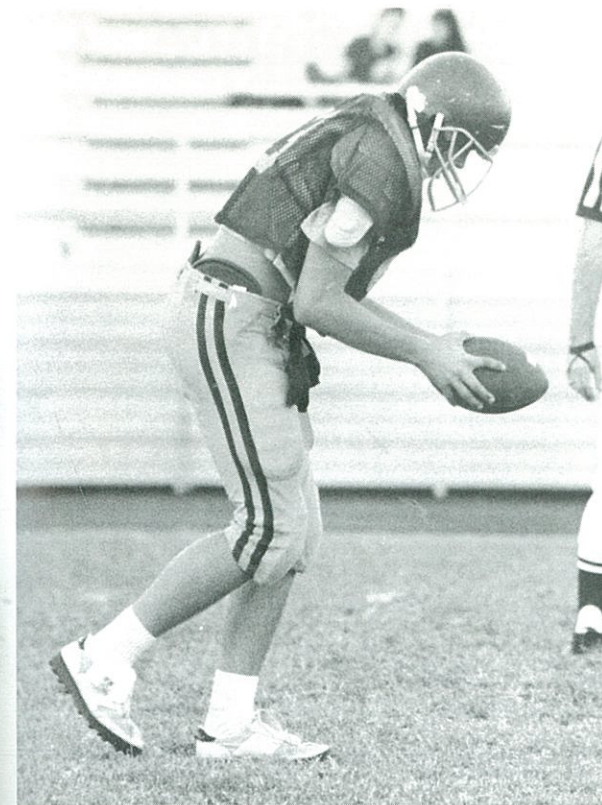
Kermit's season then got off to a slow start as the JV crew recorded four straight losses — three were to AAAAA ball clubs.

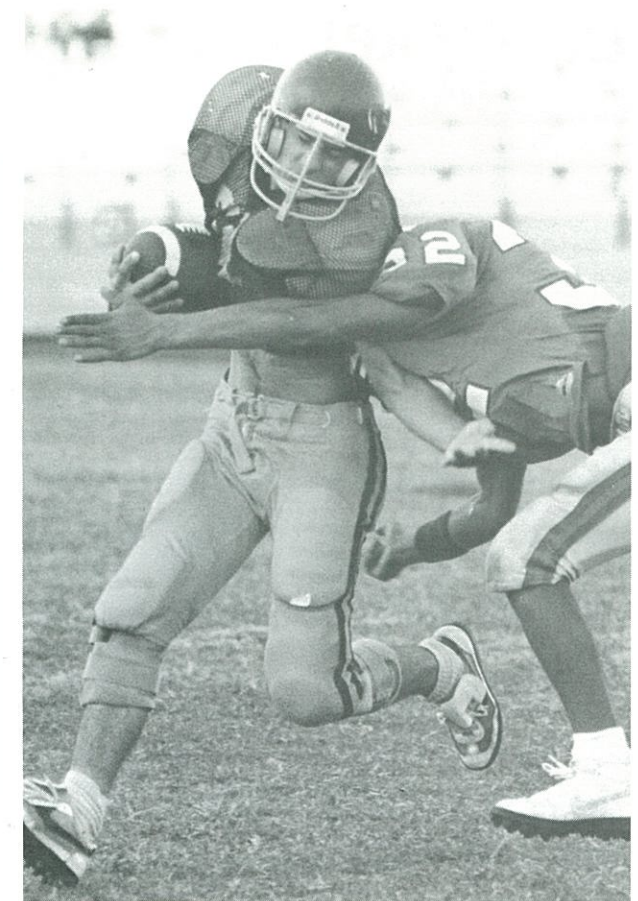

Jeff Mills, putting the moves on his opponent, is able to get away and throw another touchdown pass for the Jackets.



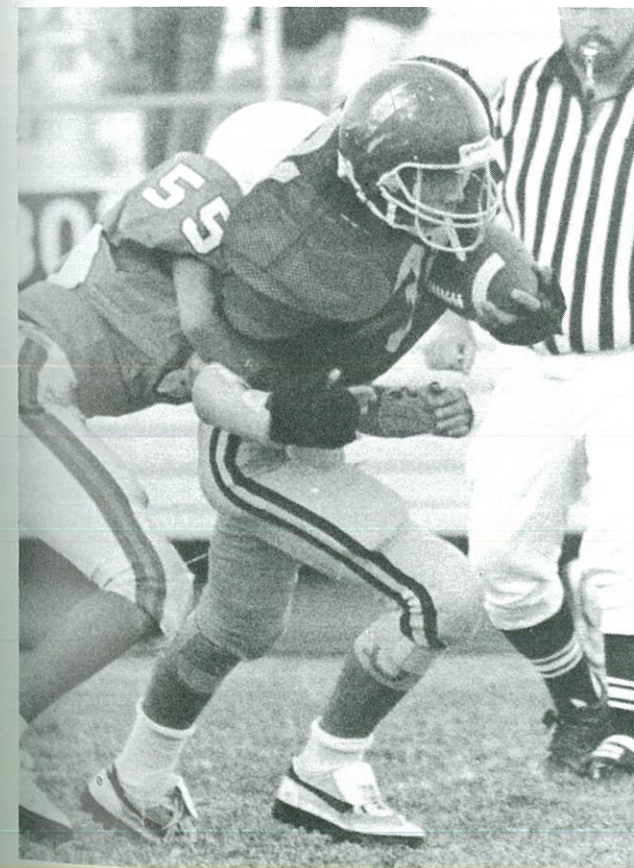
Helping the Jackets with another victory is J.V. punter Timmy Cravens.
