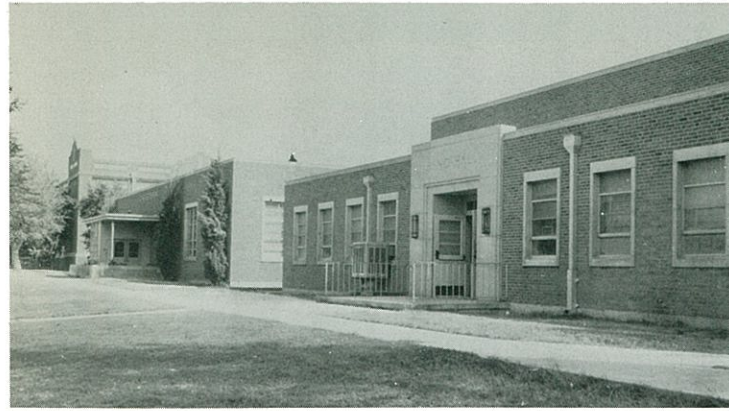

Completed in 1929

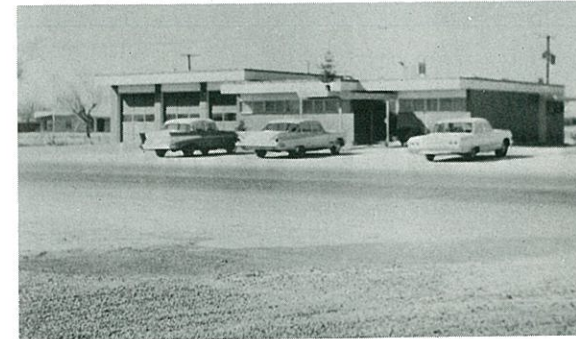

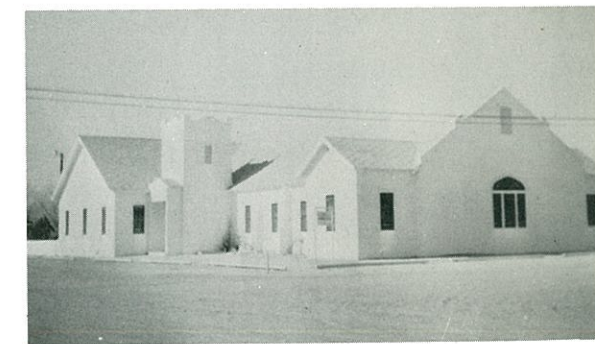
