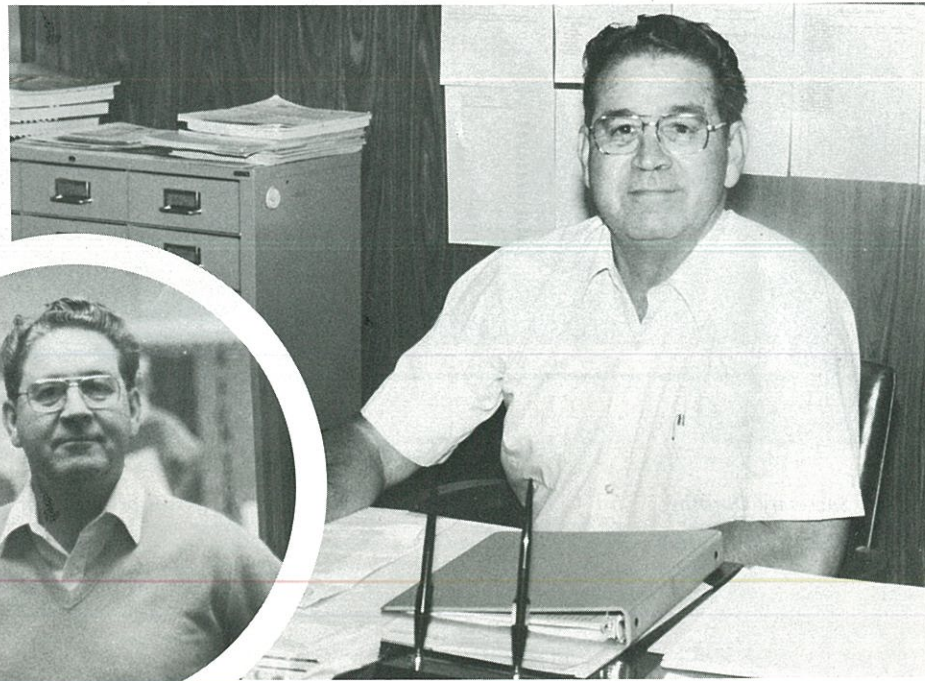

We must always give praise for our capable School Board and Superintendent. They are always positive to see that our students are in good hands.



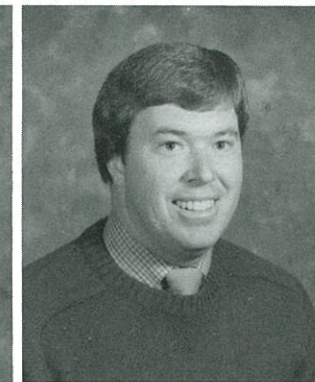
