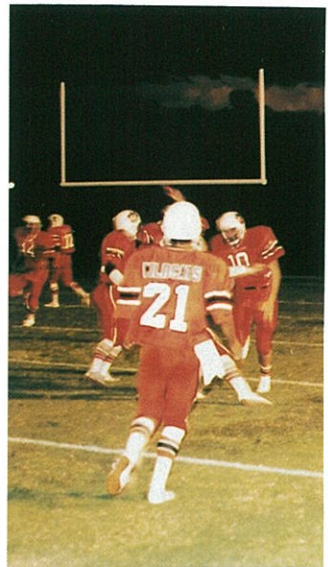


Burning with enthusiasm, the student body was very well represented at the bonfire. The 1986 bonfire was a big success in raising spirit for the up-coming game.
