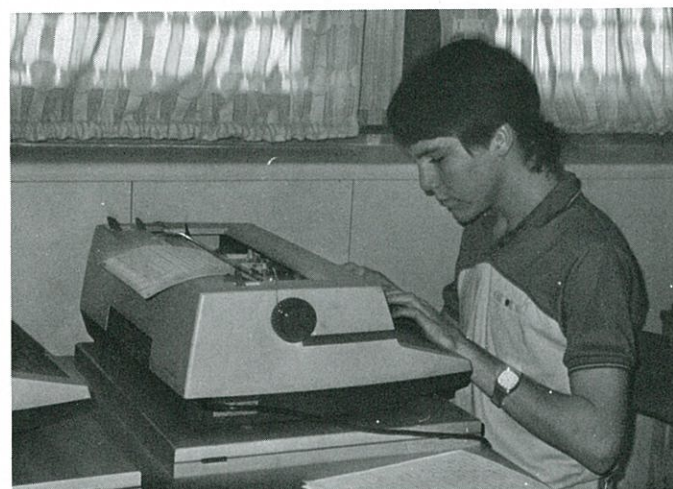
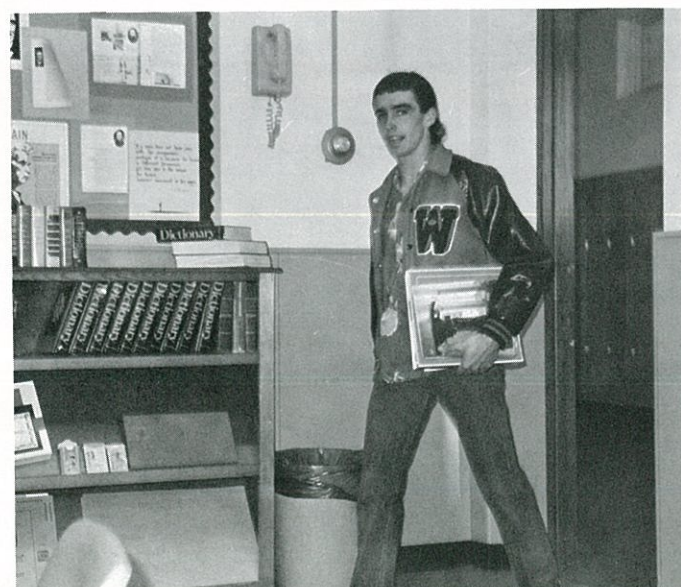


Communication In English, Journalism, Speech, & Spanish

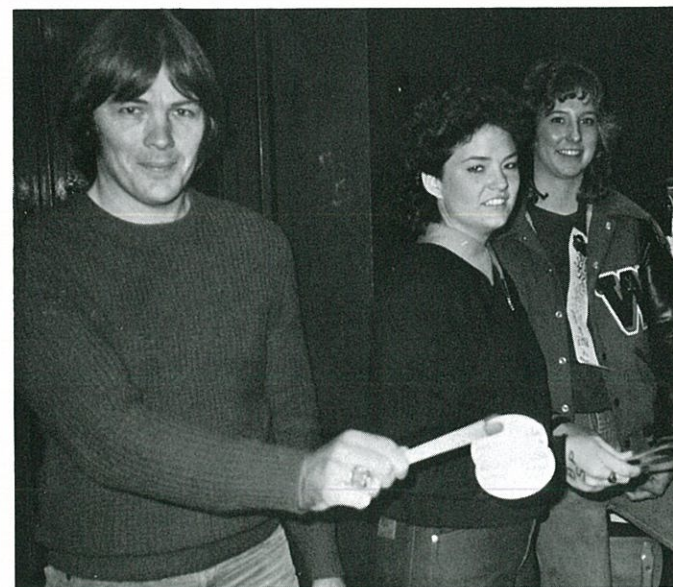
Working hard, Garland Franklin types his story for the yearbook. In addition to doing layouts, writing captions and typing copy, he designed the computer program for the index.



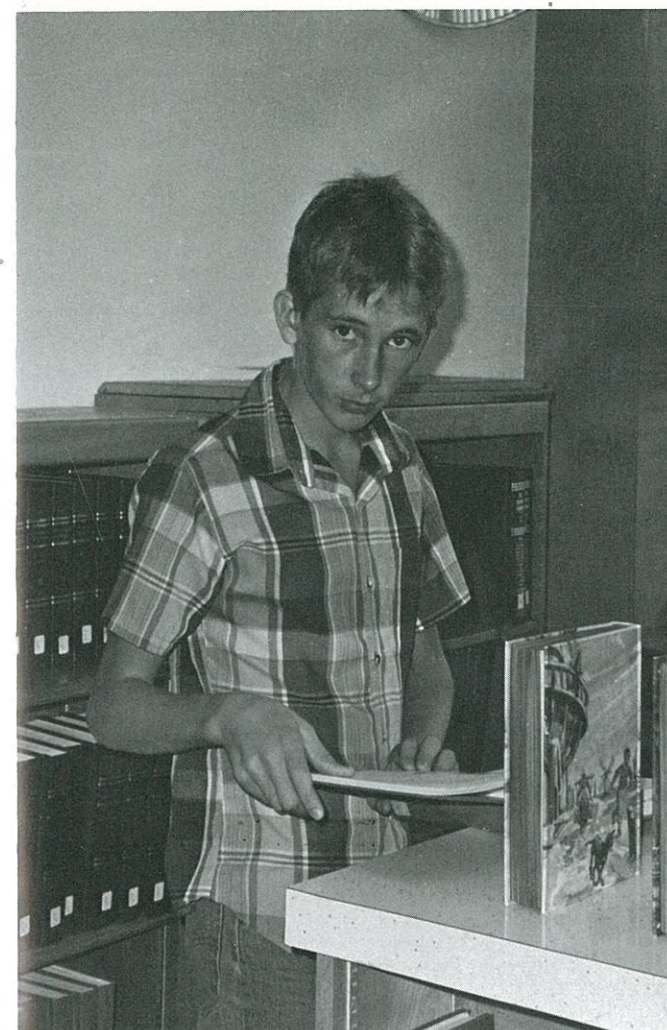

Mr. Evans, Kathy, and Shelly work in the dark room everyday. They worked throughout the year developing film and printing pictures for *The Wildcat*.

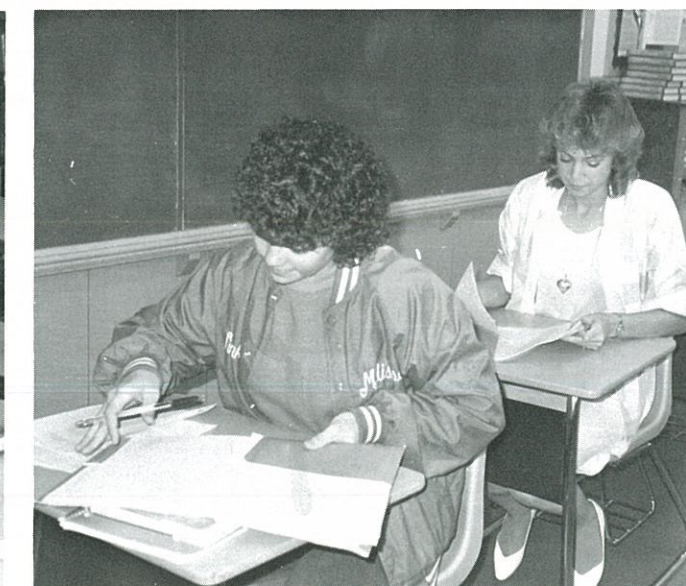


Preparing for a speech, Scott McDonald looks for information on teenage pregnancy. The research he did led to an informative speech.
