"So what's next!", Christina yells to her fellow colleagues. She remembered what was next and did a very good job for a victorious night.



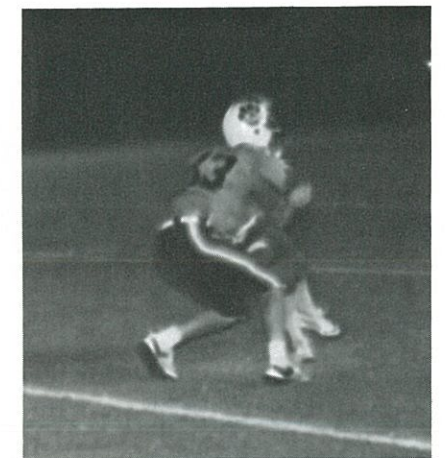
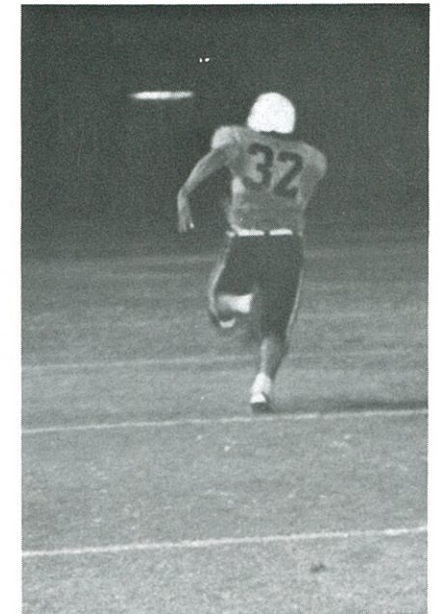
The 1986 J.V. football team had its ups and downs, but had a fine showing this season. These young Wildcats will soon become the Mighty Wildcats of the future.
