

The Saga Continues

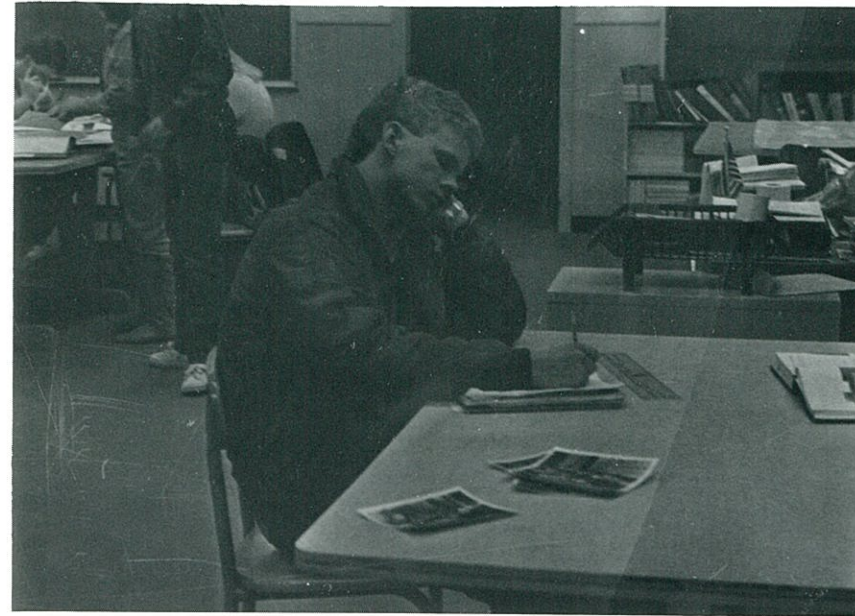
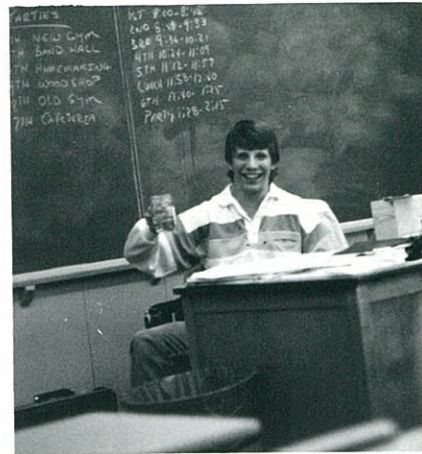

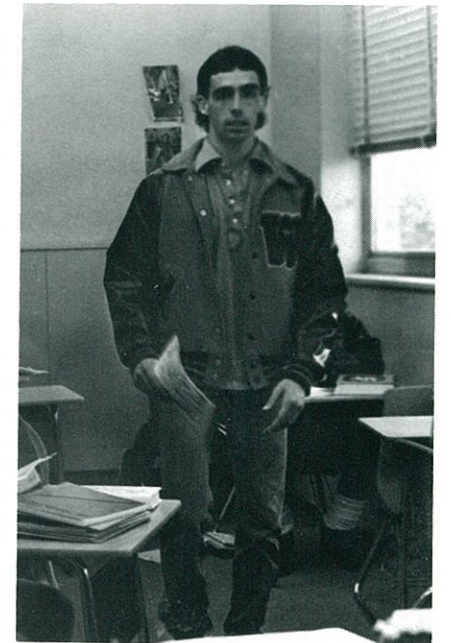
THE SAGA CONTINUES

Tommy says, "Cheers! It's finally over!" It wasn't that bad.

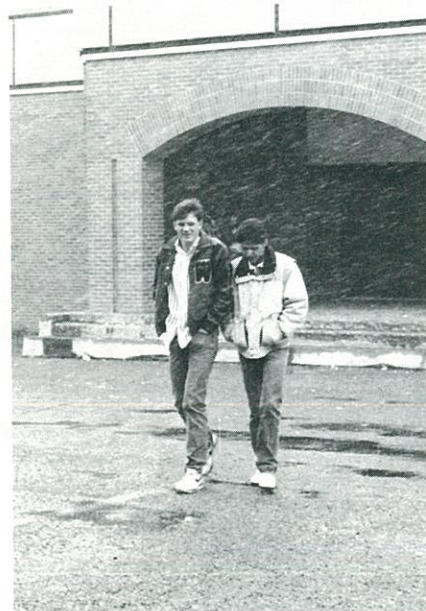


Sean is working hard in journalism. Because of such hard work and dedication, the yearbook was completed on time.

Tony passes in a vocabulary test in English. The test was a little rough, but those cartoons sure were funny.

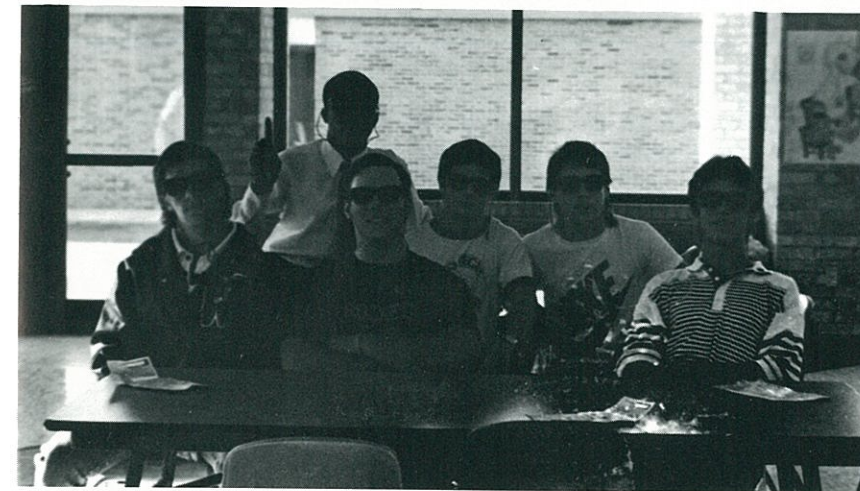
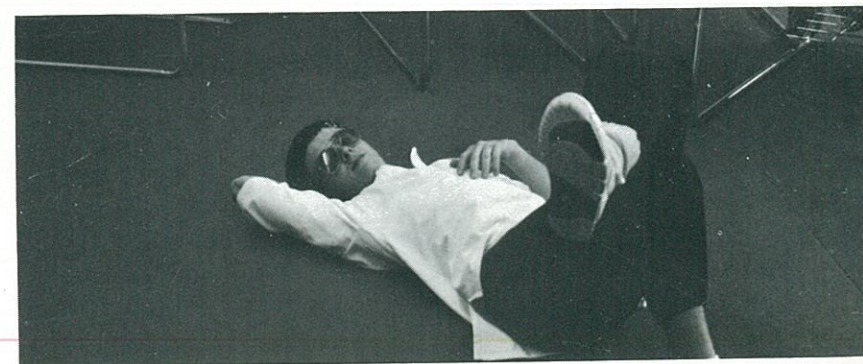

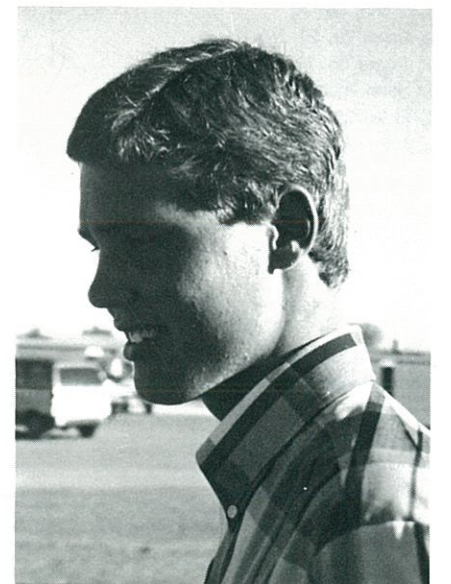
Danny and Junior walk in the snow with all of their friends. Lunchtime was always fun, especially in the snow. Oh Boy!
