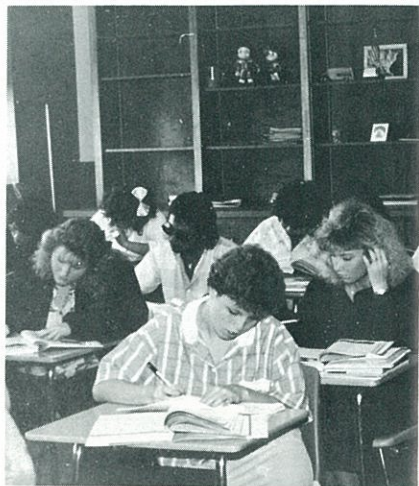


Entree

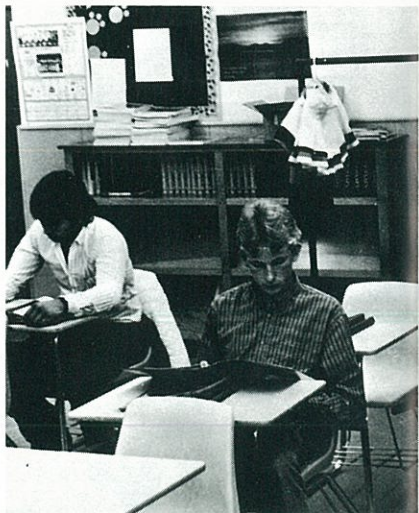

Kristi Jones listens intently in her United States Government class. Her mind was working, but her feet were on break.

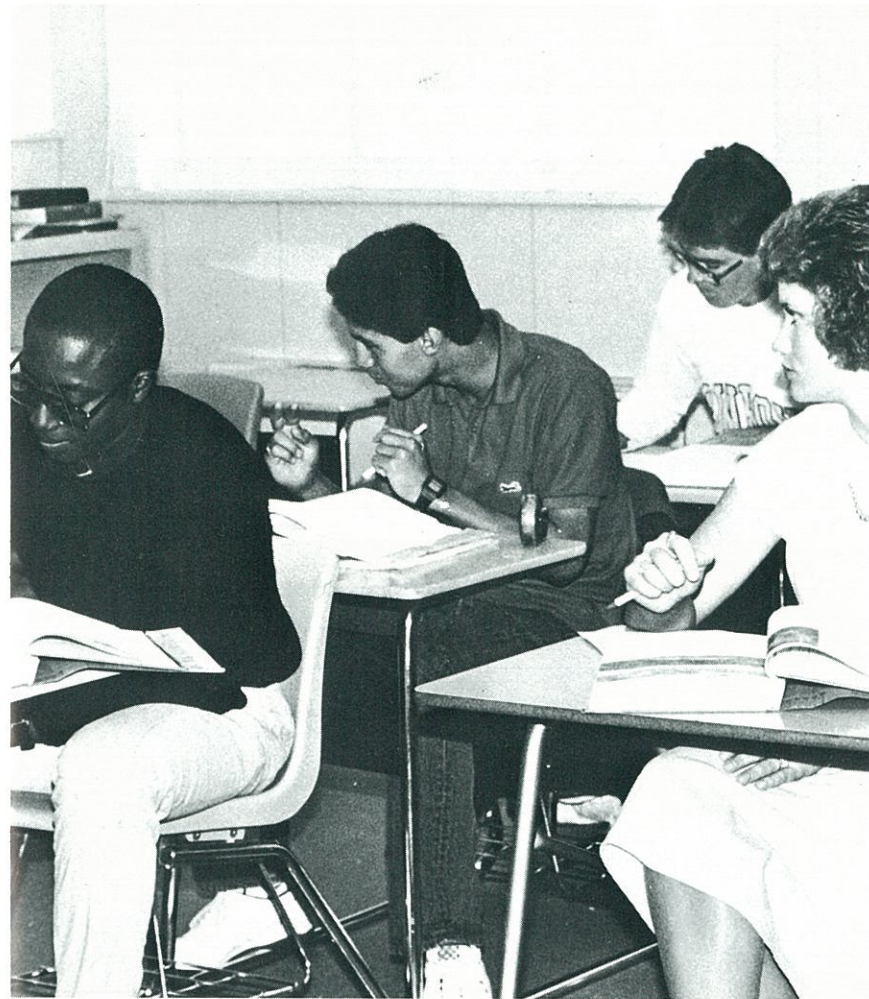
In Health class every student is trying to finish their work before the bell catches them. They had one more question to finish.

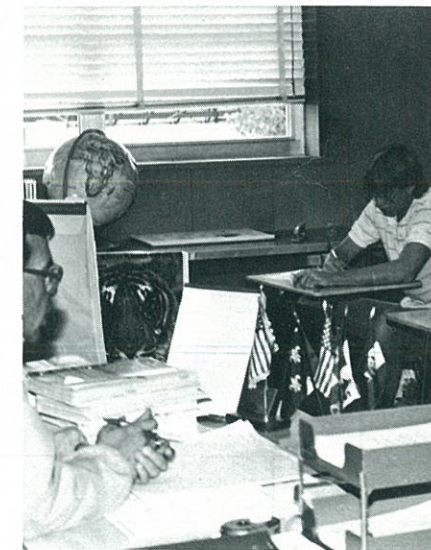


The economics class works on a group project related to entrepreneurship. They made plans for becoming tomorrow's Fortune 500 companies.

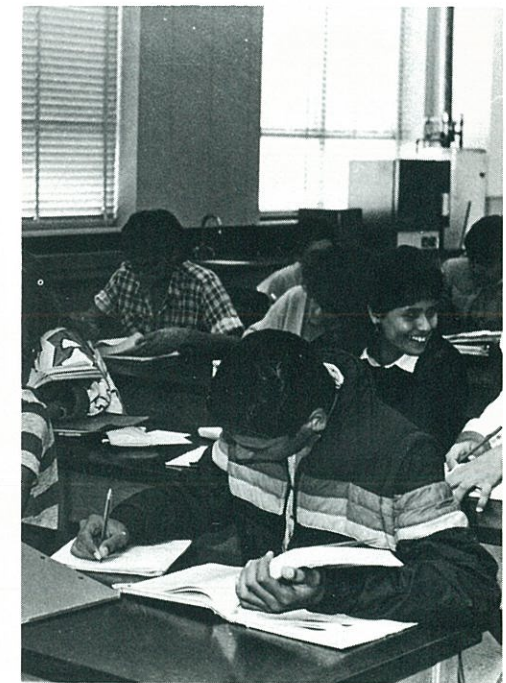
Junior and Tony are checking on number 5. John worked confidently on his own.
