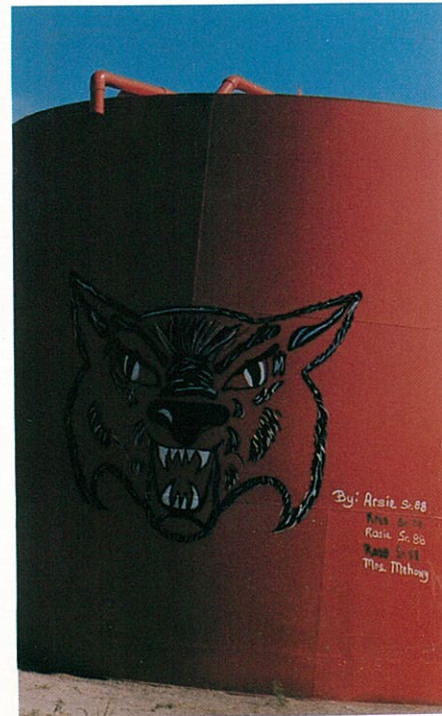


Signs Of Pride

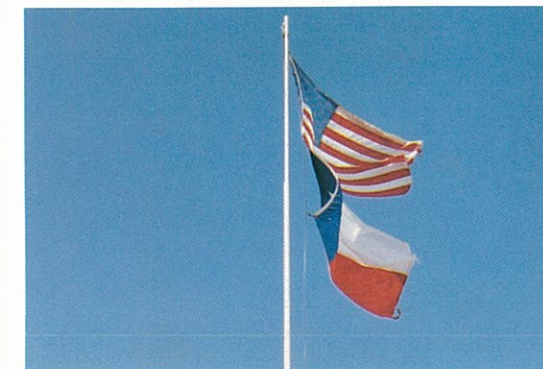
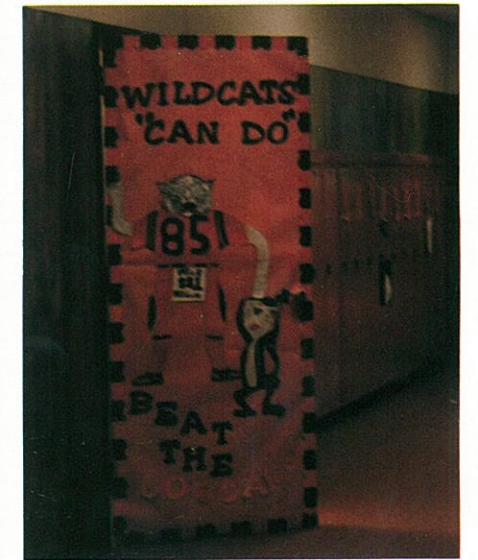
The flame is a symbol of the spirit that burns in the hearts of Wildcats. A lot of work was put into the building of the bonfire this year by a number of the Wink students.
