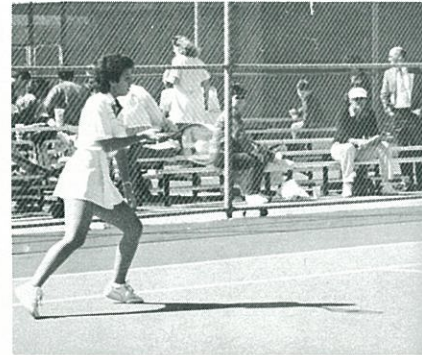
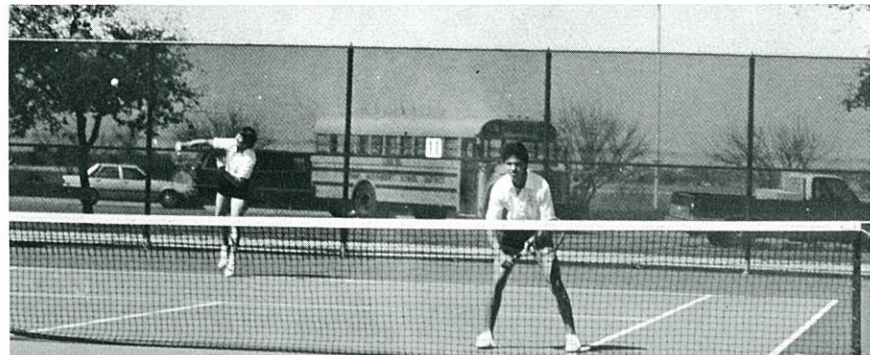


Wimbledon Bound

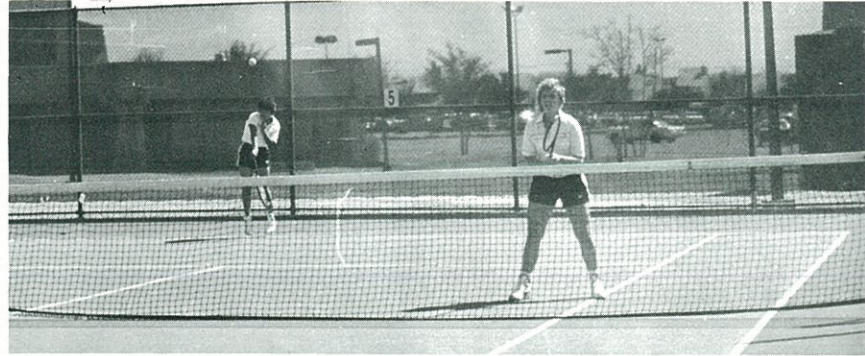

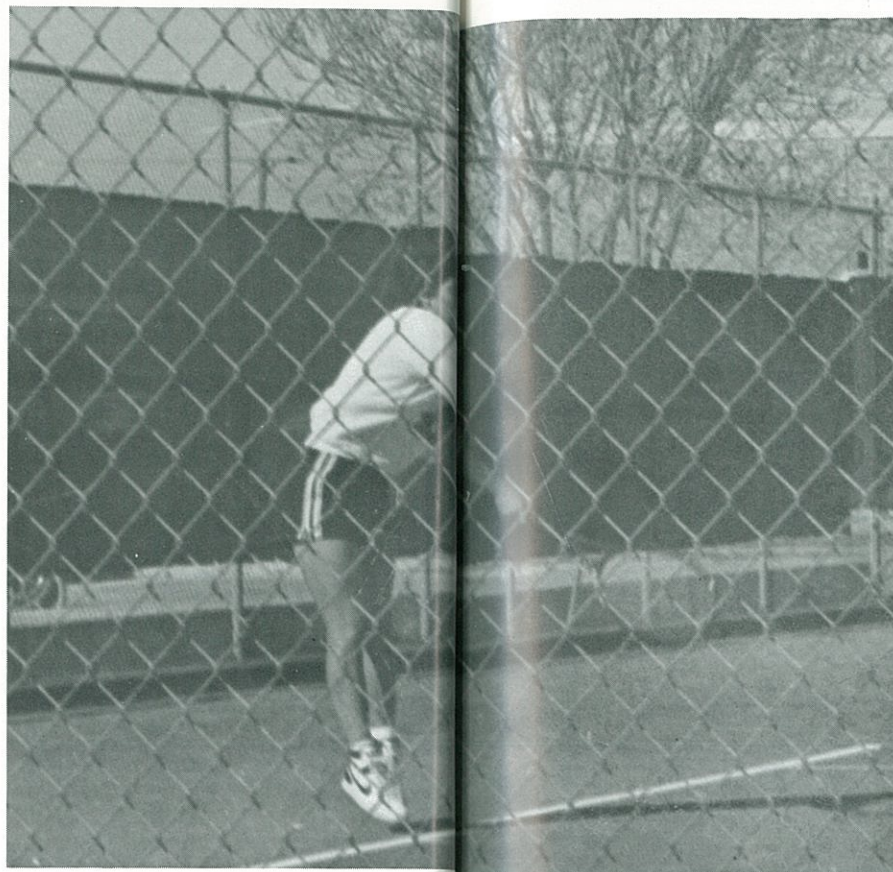

Veronica serves to their opponent and Kristi is ready for the volley. With all their hard effort they managed to win the point and the game.

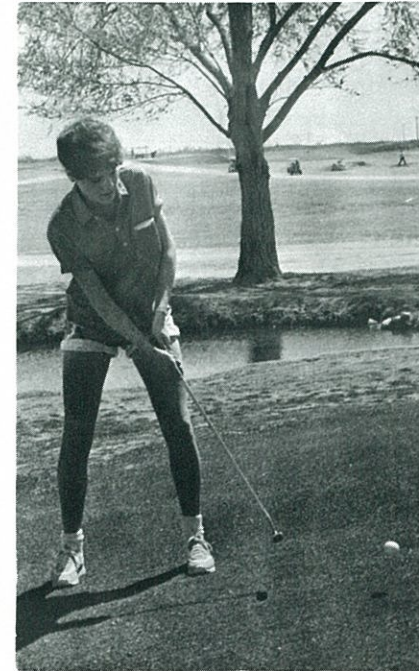
Amy hits a powerful forehand during the Midland Tournament. Coach Crawford watched impatiently as she attempted to win the point.
