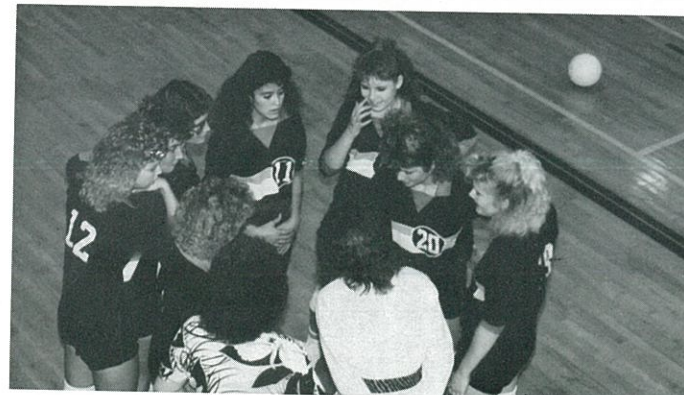


Lady Cats Won't Stop Til They're On Top!

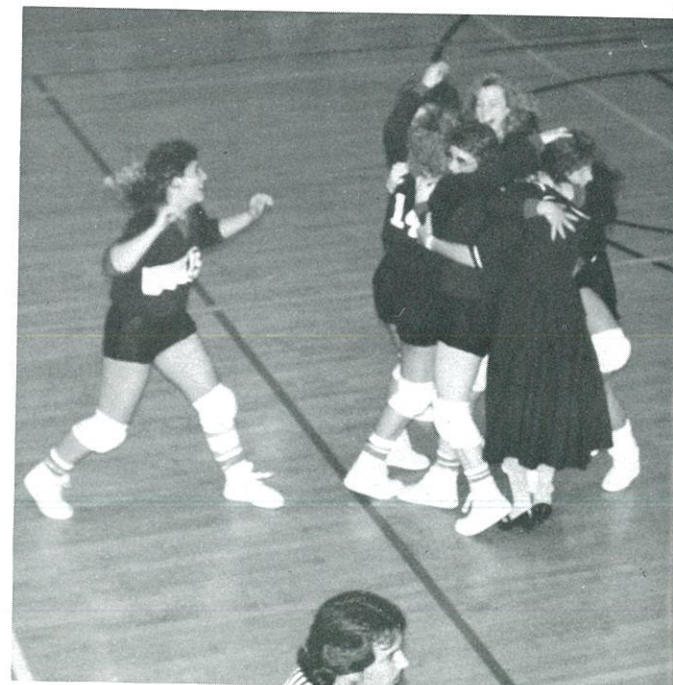
