

had our hopes, dreams, fears, and ambitions in the start of the school year, we have these same feelings in the end, because again we have stepped forward into the unknown.






The Wink teachers start losing "it" at the end of the year when they think they've become farm animals. These teachers performed to raise money for the ATPE scholarship.

110 The Wink band is always working hard. It all paid off when they won two first divisions at contest.




