Senior Leigh Ann Powell said, "When you get up at 4:30 in the morning you don't care what you look like."

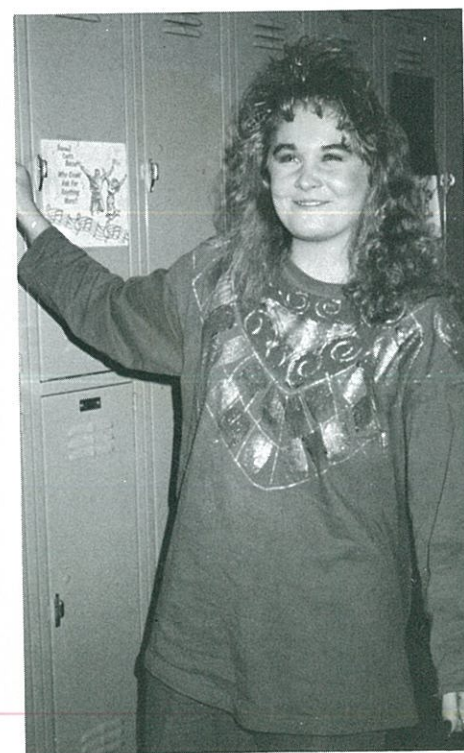
Senior Mariela Estrada said, "I dress to conform. I go to Mexico to shop because the clothes are more stylish and they have more to choose from."

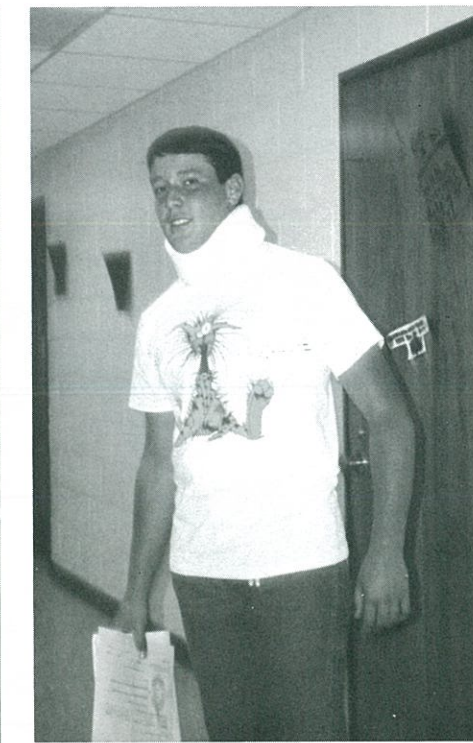
