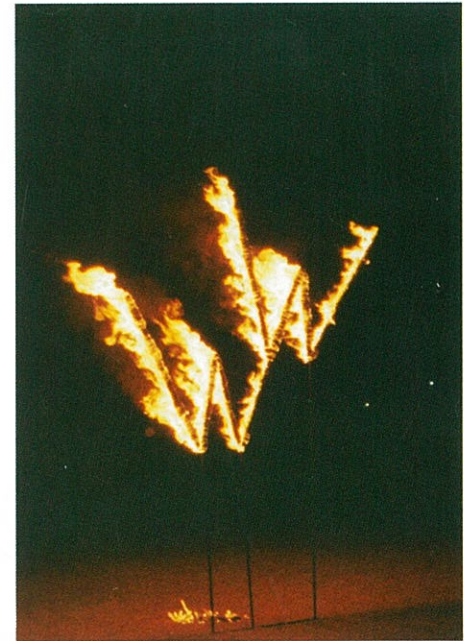

academics. Fun things included all-school dances, a hayride and wiener roast at Christmas, and break time.

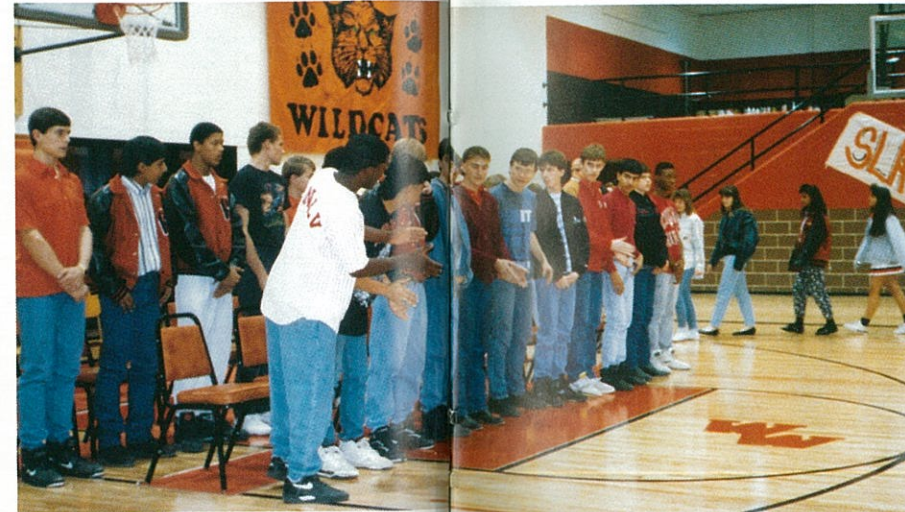
All in all, students accepted the changes and established new traditions and a new outlook on school life. Students conquered the negative effects of change and made the most of the 1991-92 school year.
