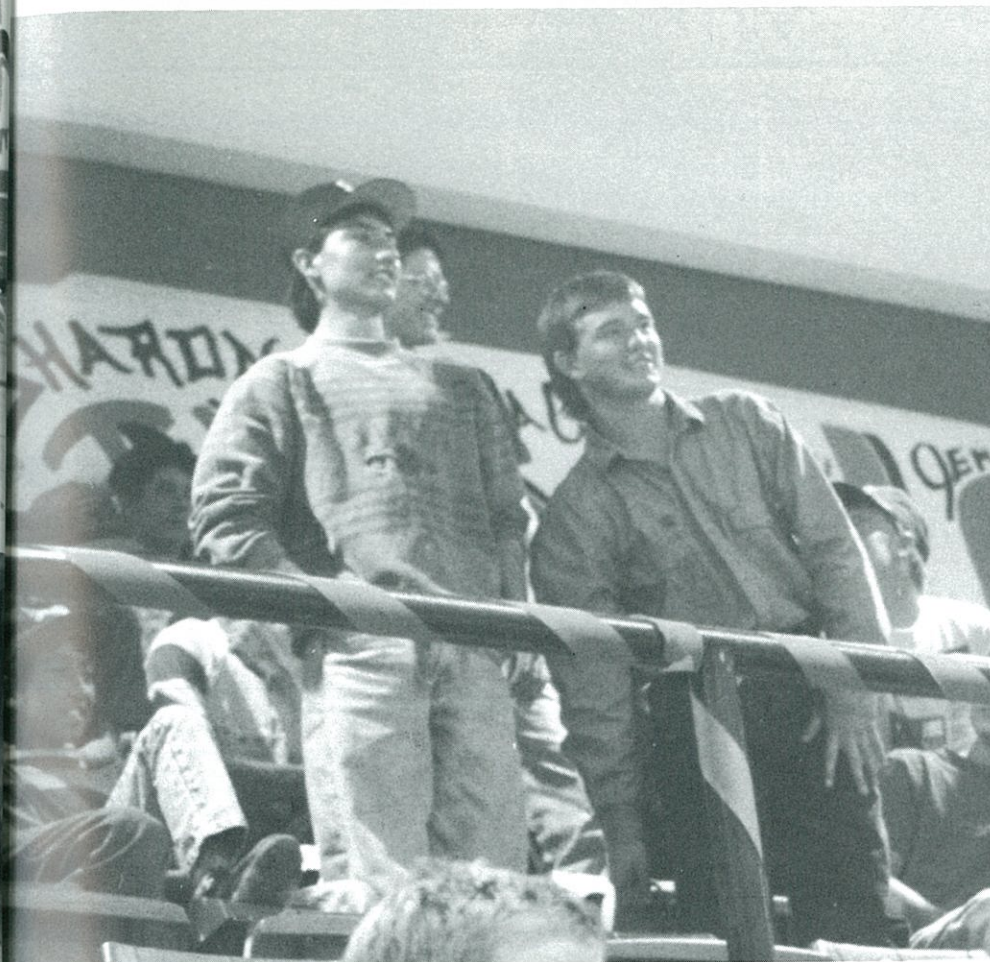


Sophomore Wildcats focus their attention on the pep rally speaker in preparation for the game against Eunice.

Carlton Gillette gets on his knees for Mr. Carroll Eggleston to help him roll up the black plastic that covered the multiplication charts during TAAS testing.

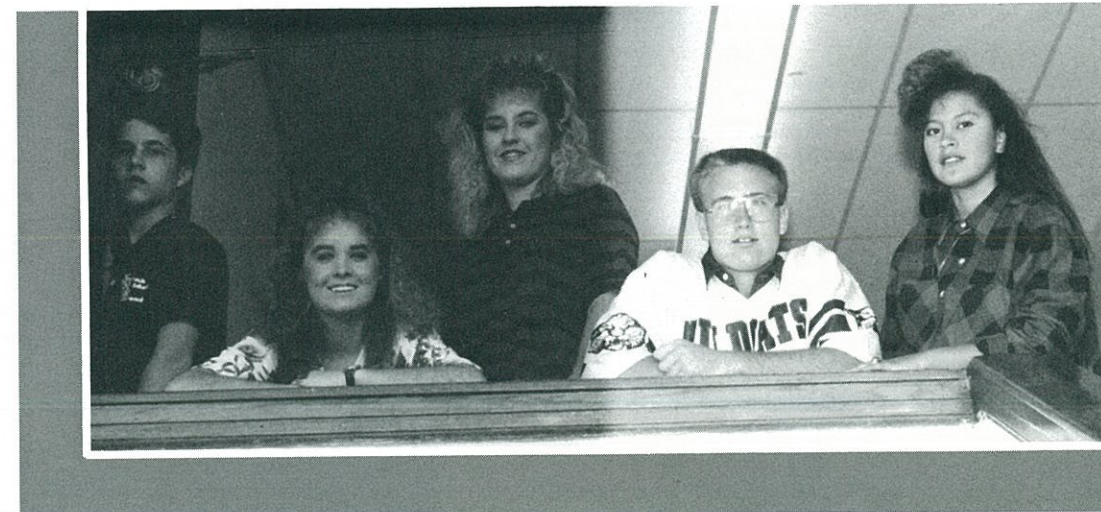
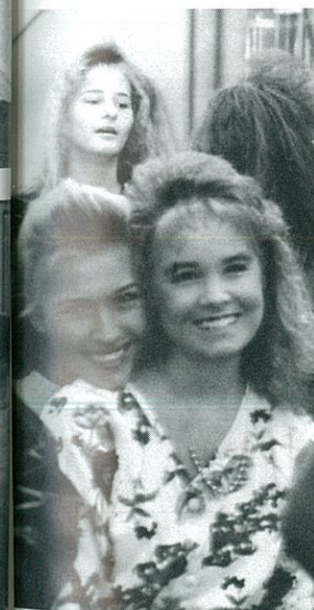
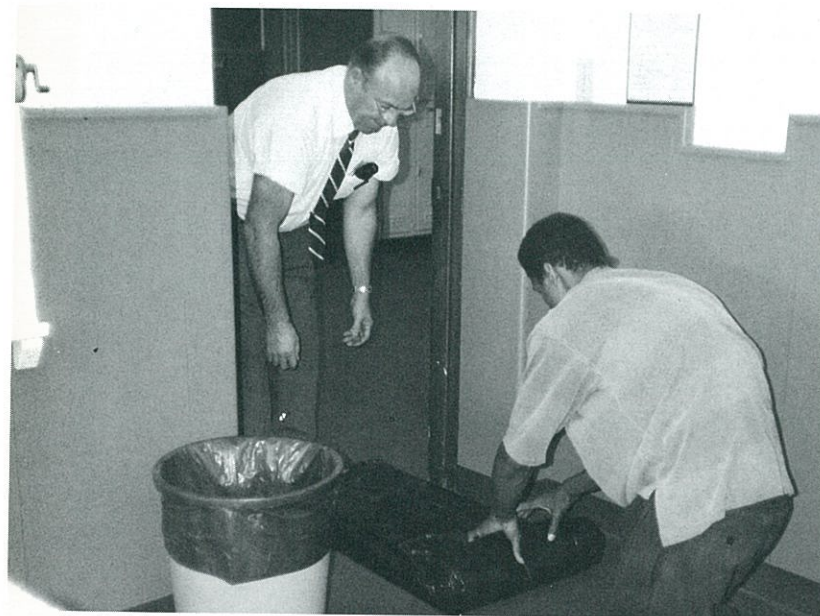


Juniors and sophomores are the middle children of the Wink High School family. They are easy-going and good with other people.

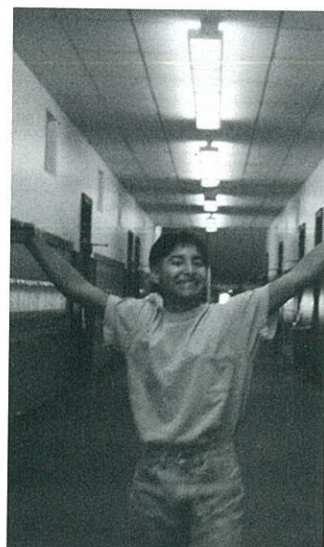
By their smiles you can tell that they are achievers and perfectionists but the pressure is off because they still have time to succeed.

"Cats, Cats, Go, Go, Go!" Juniors vie for the weekly spirit stick.



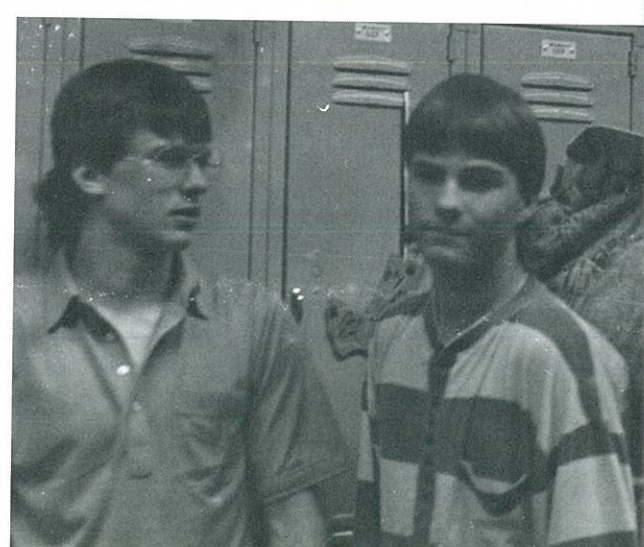
