

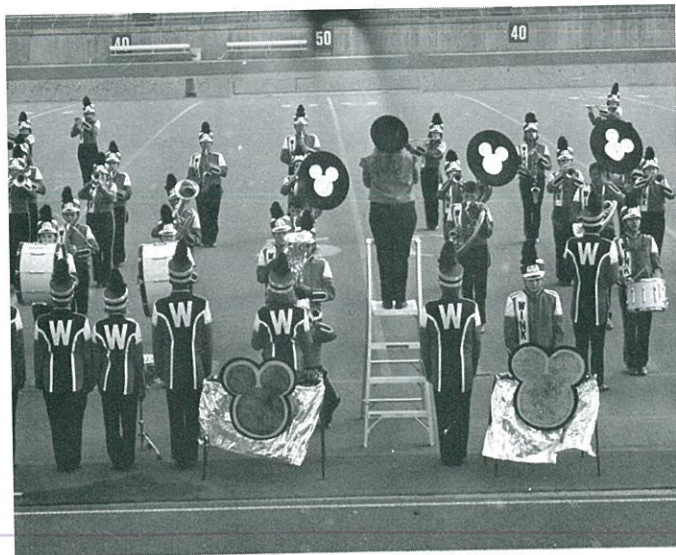
Baad Cat Band

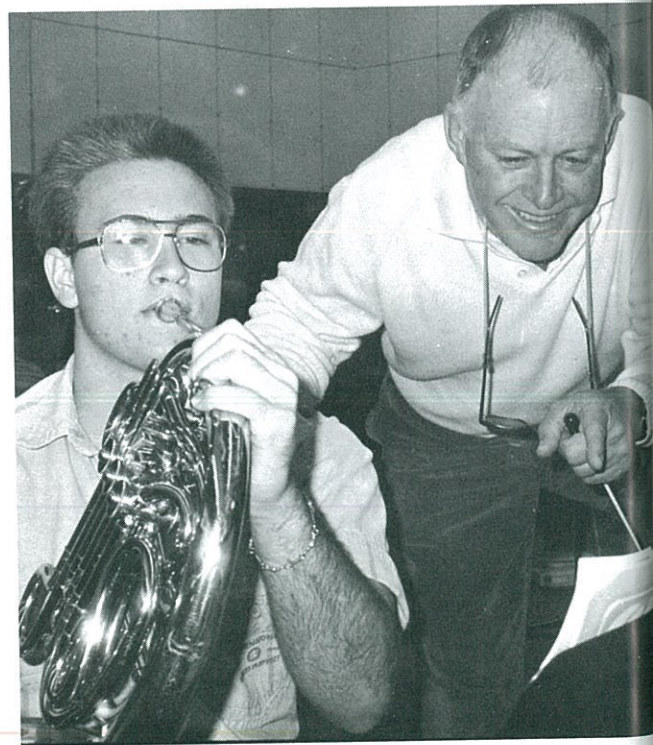

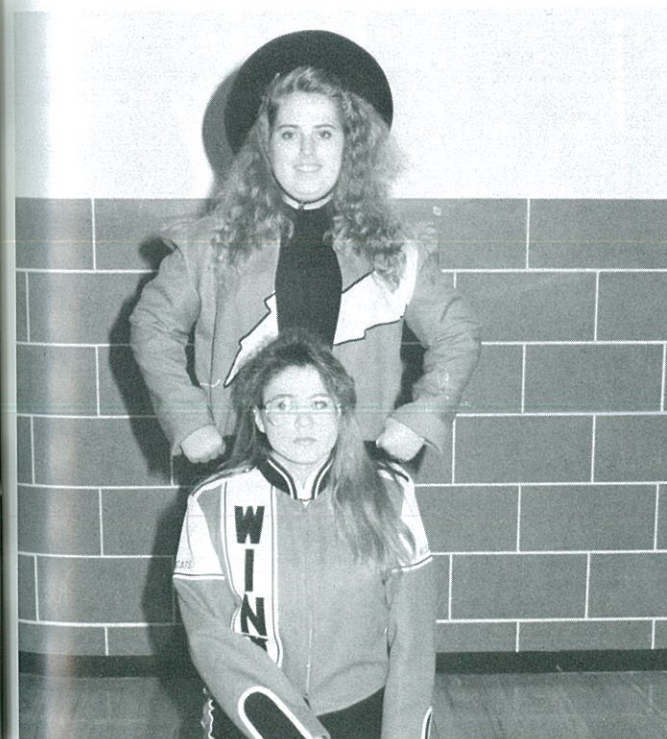
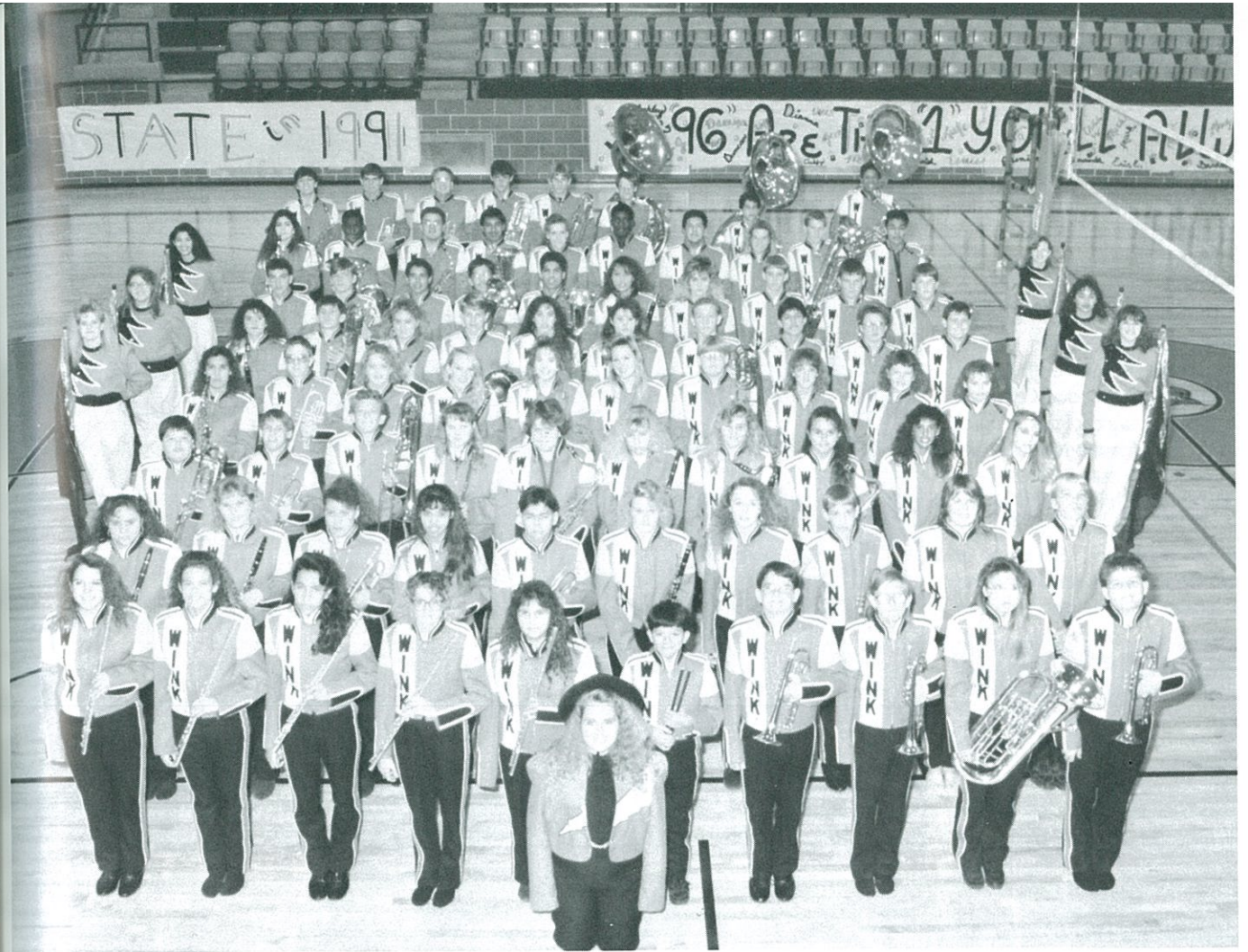
