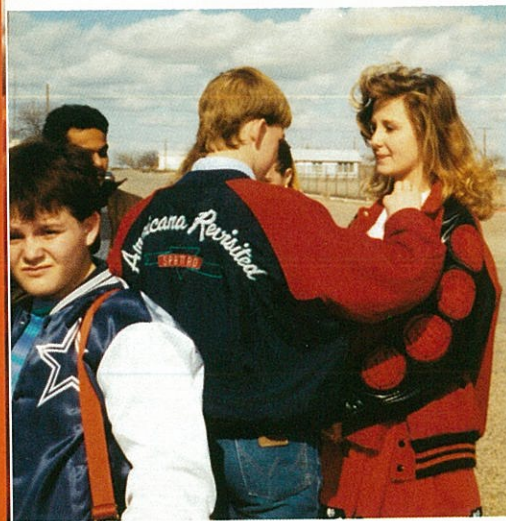


## Nothing Else Matters

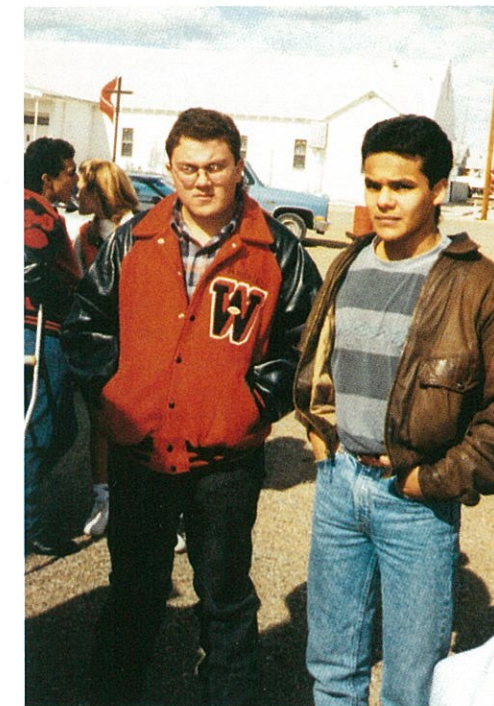

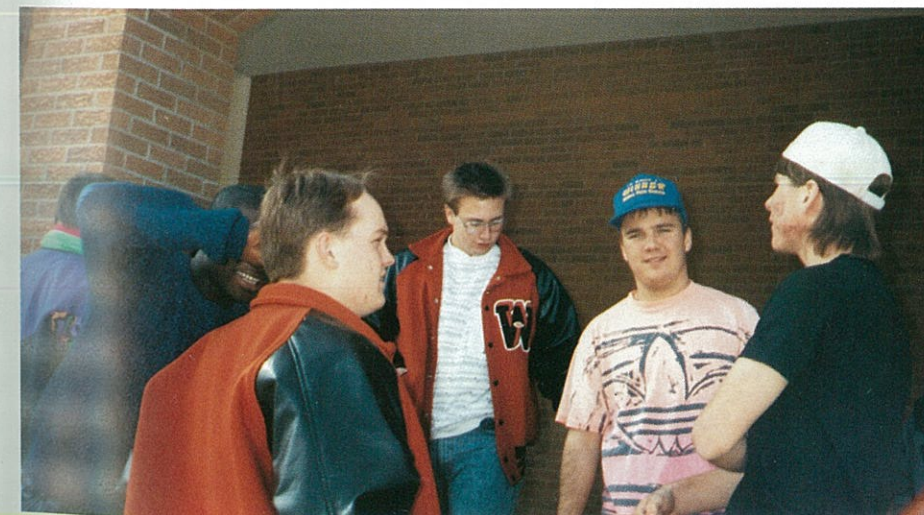
