Grading papers, typing, putting up bulletin boards, assisting in labs, running errands were daily tasks for the aides.

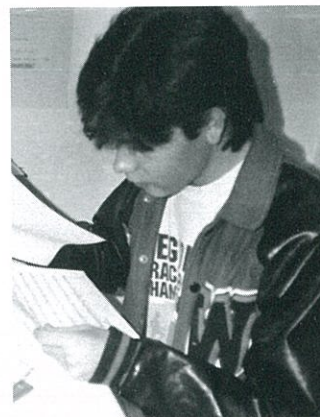
While it was an accommodation for teachers, it was a learning experience for students. Every aide developed a basic idea of the responsibilities teachers have and what teaching is like.

Seventh period aide, senior Daniella Garcia said, "The teacher's aide program is an enlightment; it showed me how difficult being a teacher really is."

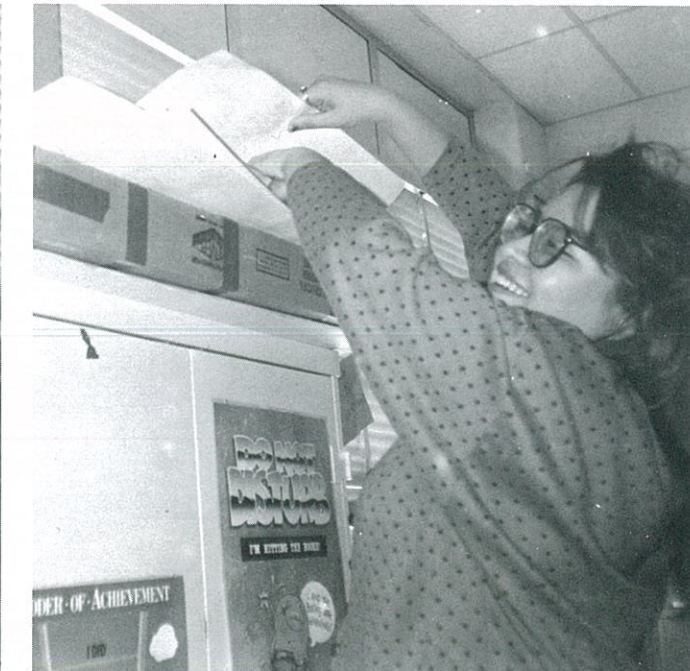
