

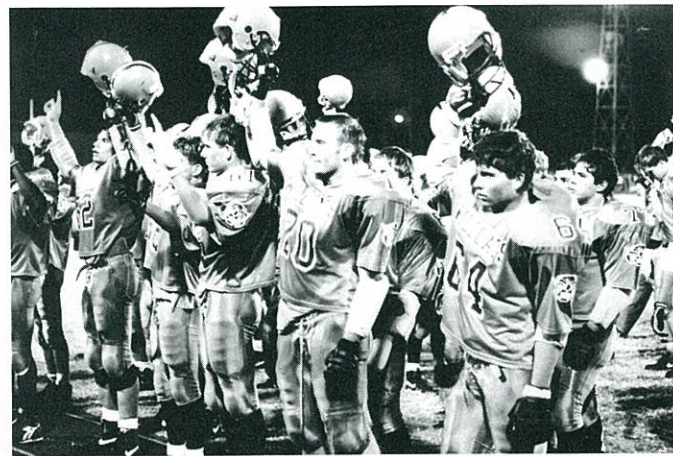
All in a Day's Work

But the hard work and dedication paid off as Wildcats met with success in athletics, academics, and just plain having fun.

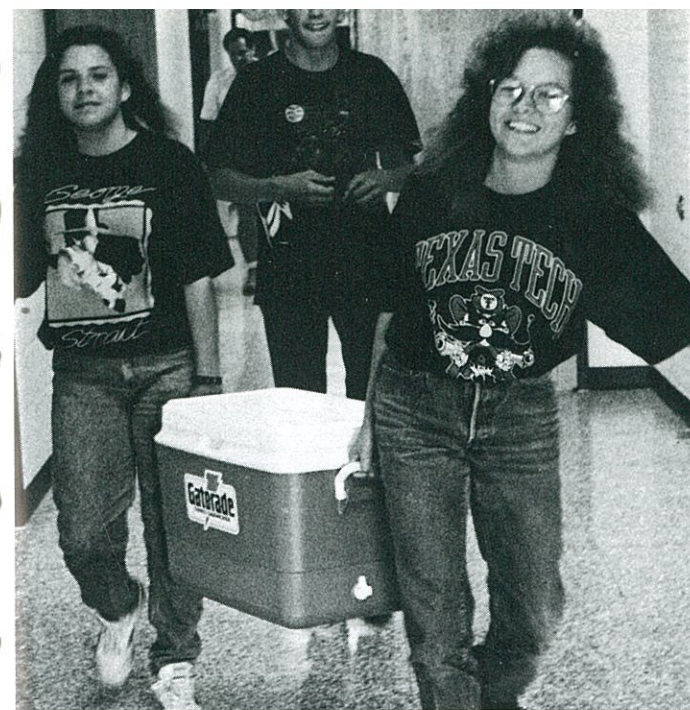


Sophomore Billy Bynum pulls double-duty as he comes off the sidelines in his football uniform and grabs his cornet to march with the band at halftime.

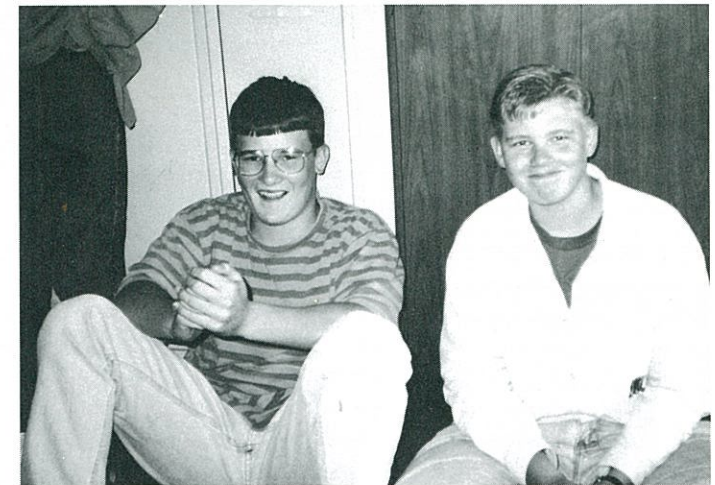
The varsity Wildcats keep their heads high during the victory march after a hard-fought fourth quarter loss to Rankin.

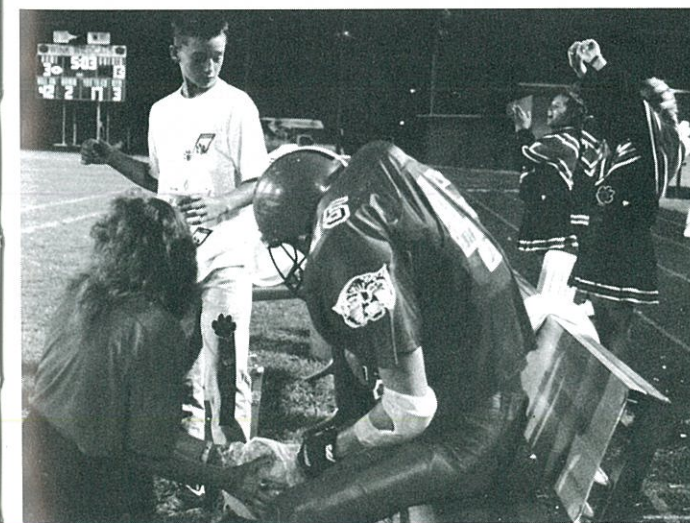
