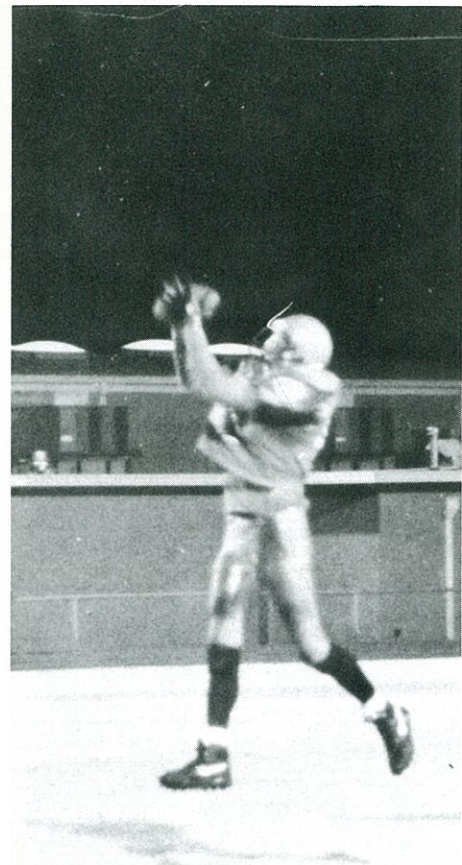

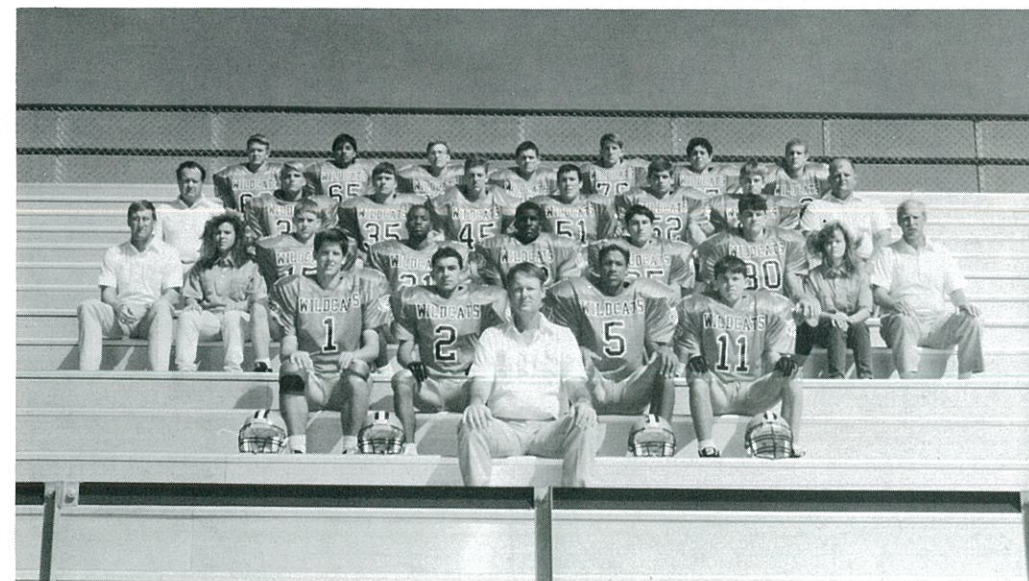

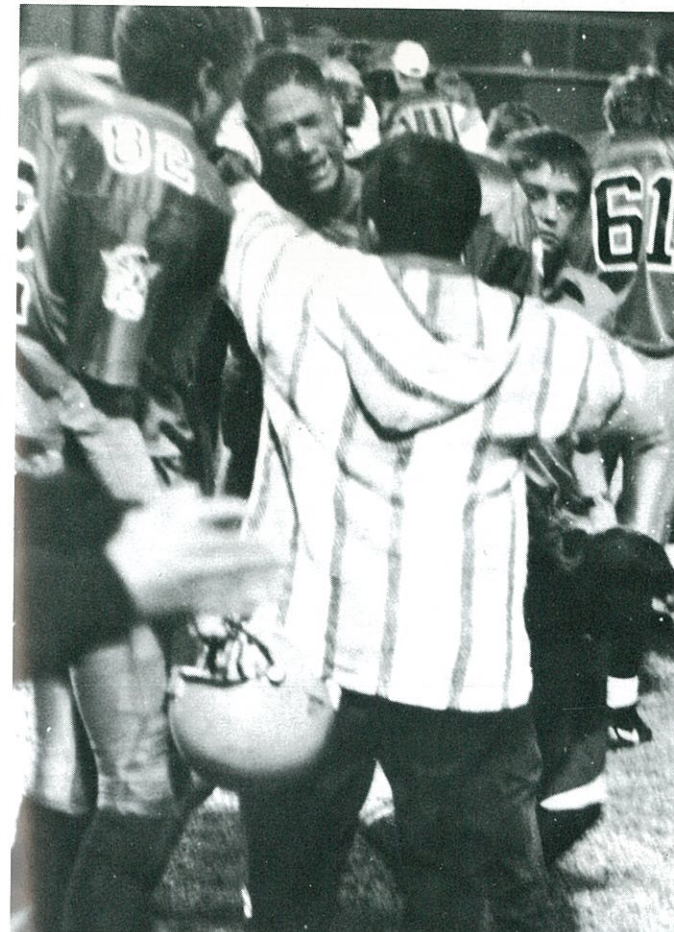
J.J. McVay catches a pass from Shae Scott in an easy over-the-middle play against Plains in the area play-off game.

Second team All-District selections included Mike Miranda, J.J. McVay, Shane Haynes, Peter Lara, and Gillette.

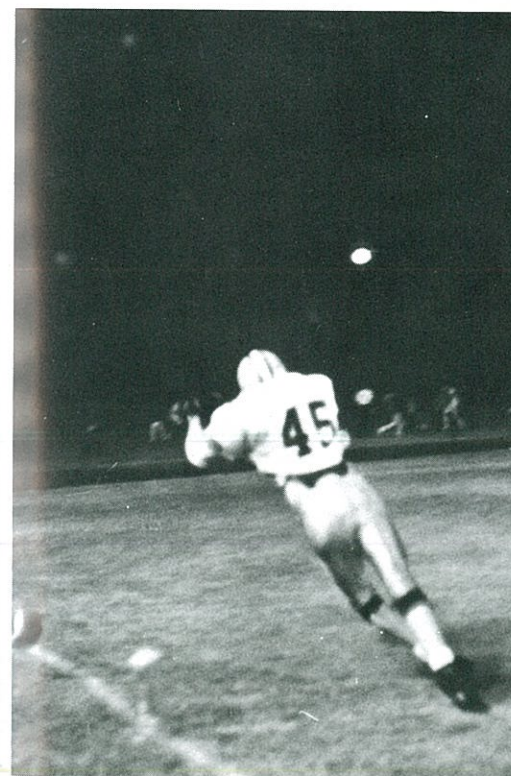
Honorable mention included Tony Williams, Micha Roundtree, T. Gabe Loftin, Brian Lovell and Glenn Underwood.

Carlton Gillette lets the agony of losing to Plains in the area game take over his emotions. The loss ended the Wildcats' 7-3 season.

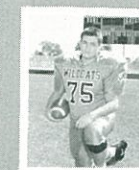
