All-district players were Lucy Valenzuela, Marti and Jodi Carlton, Kristi Northcutt and Stephanie Maddux.

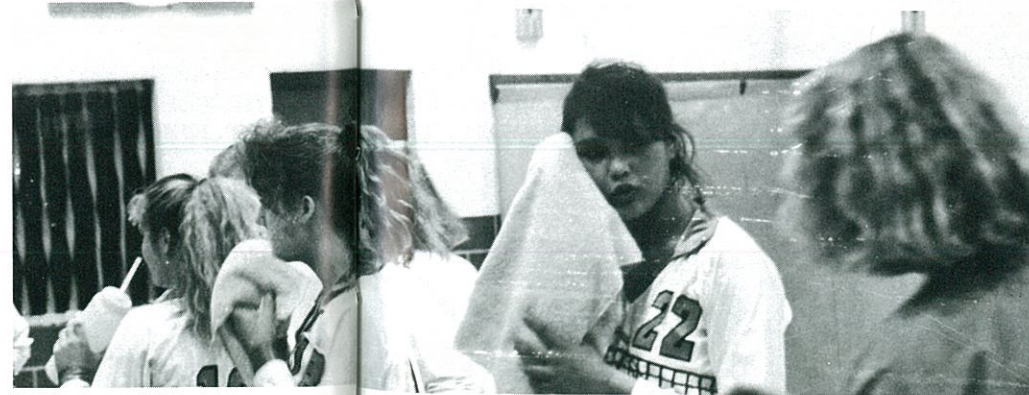
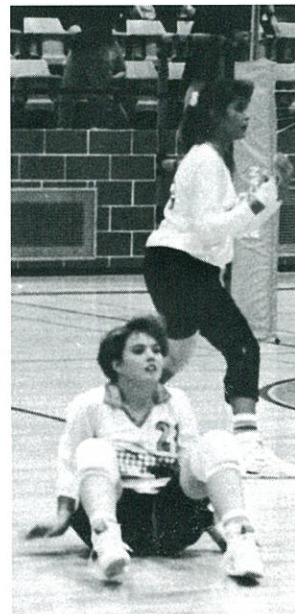
For some of the Lady Cats it was the beginning of the end of a successful volleyball season, but those who are returning are looking forward to another very strong, exciting year.

"Get up off that thing!" Dianna Ratliff makes an attempt on the floor as Lucy Valenzuela advances to the net.

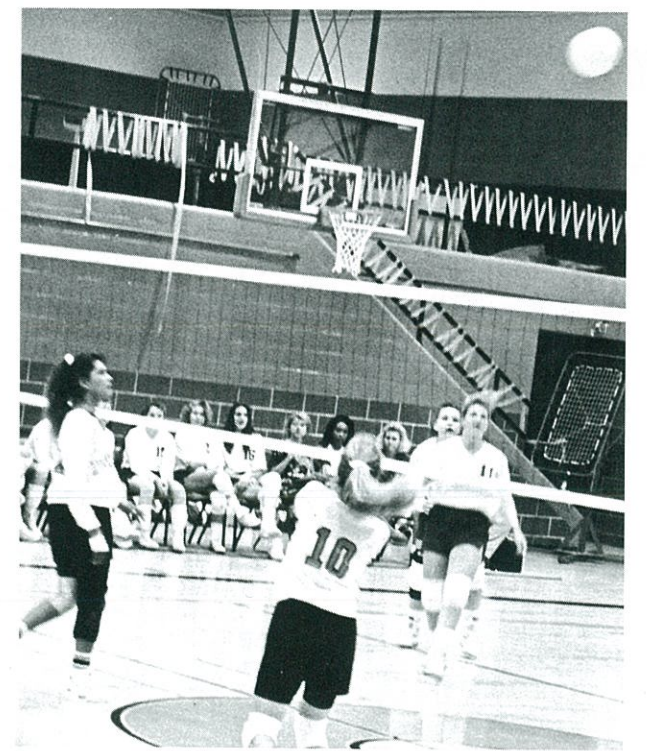

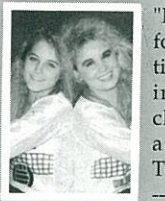
The District Champs take a break between games to enjoy towels and drinks provided by manager Brande Scott.

Kristi Northcutt and Ana Miranda get down preparing to prowling on their opponents.



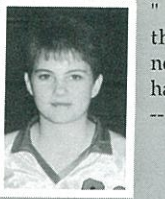

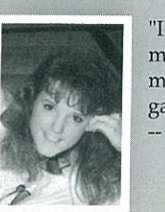
