
Senior Marcie Sledge concentrates as she recreates a picture of her mother and two sisters.

Junior Brande Scott has been playing the guitar since the third grade, and since childhood she has wanted to be a singer. Her influence has been Dolly Parton.


Sophomore Shannon Parham started
