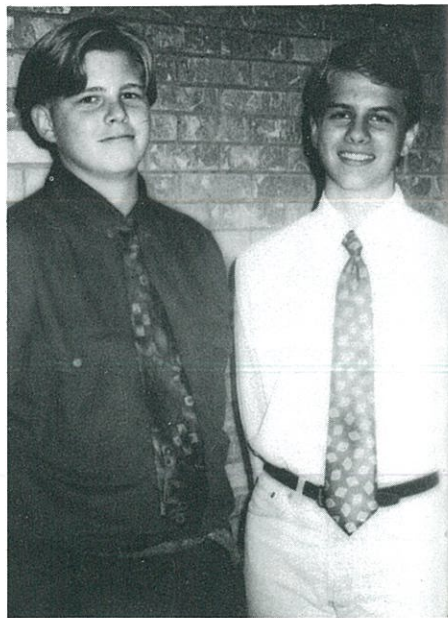

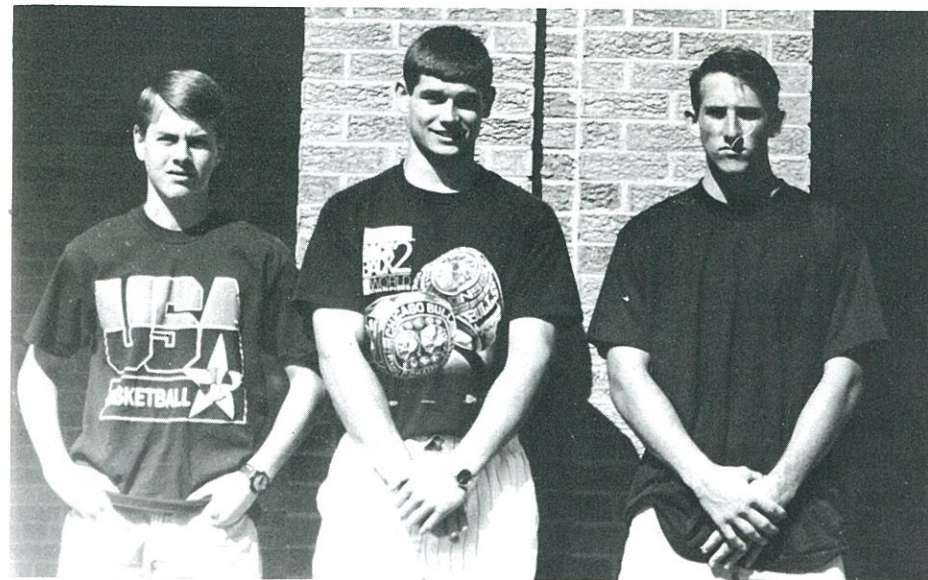
Waiting for their results, Jeffrey Watts and John Adams pass time by playing pool at the recreation center at the regional meet in Levelland.

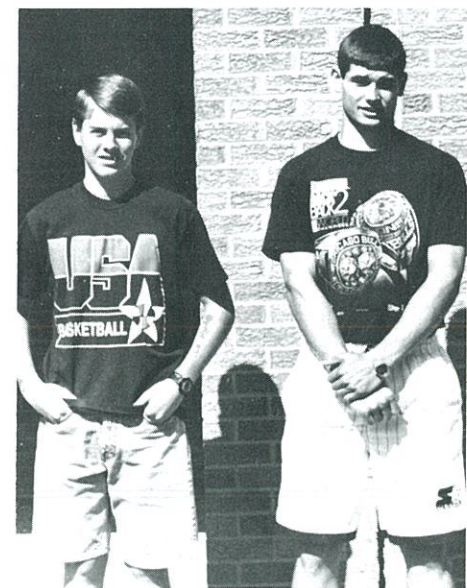
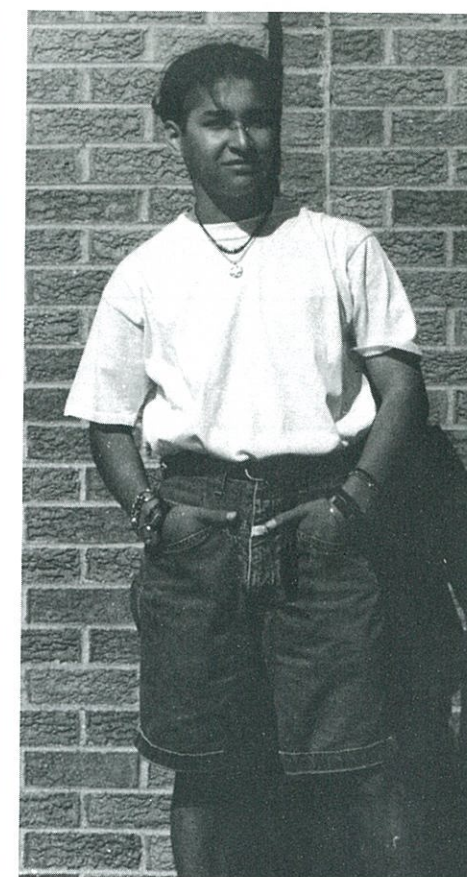


Merrick Brown and John Adams were two writers who advanced to regionals in the journalism events.
