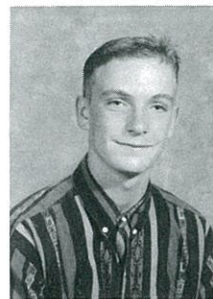


Still on the Prowl

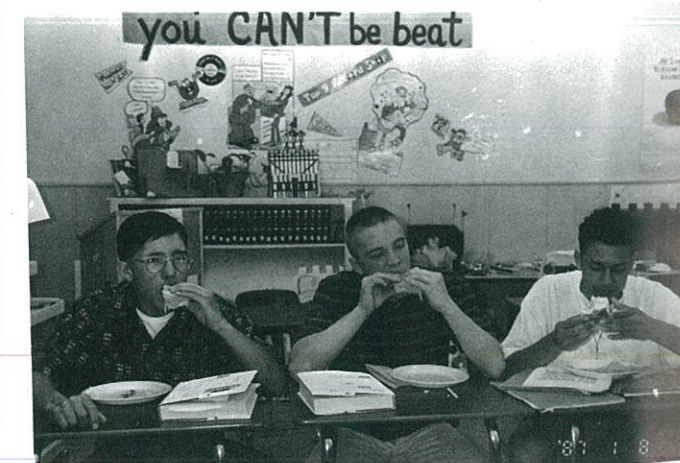
James was a good friend.

I cried.

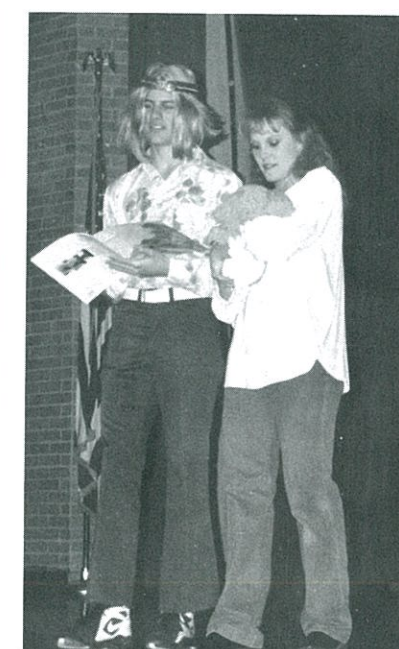
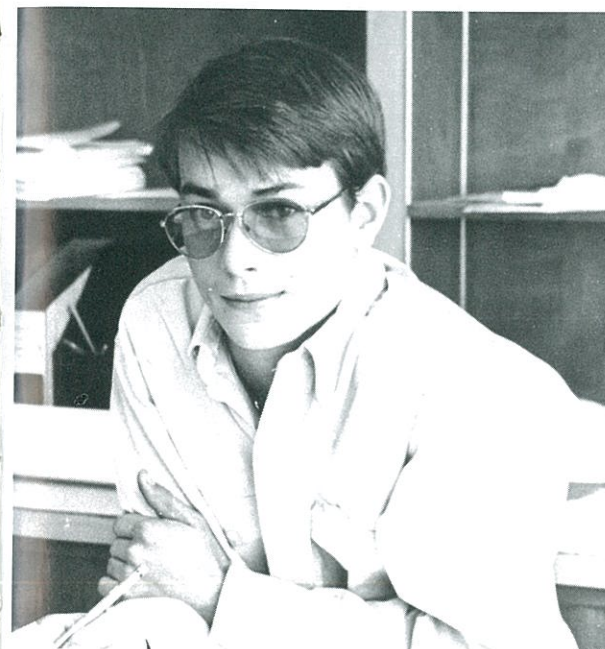
