

Administrators Lead the Way

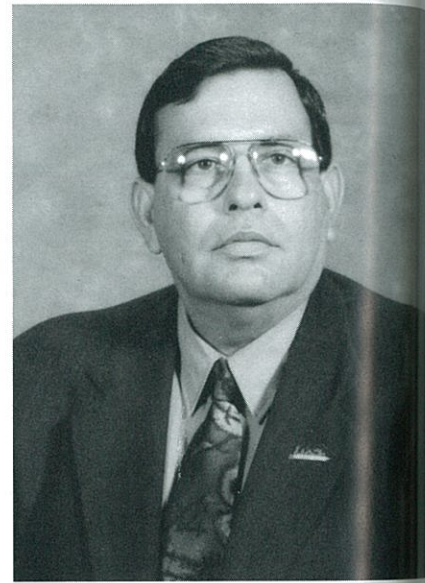
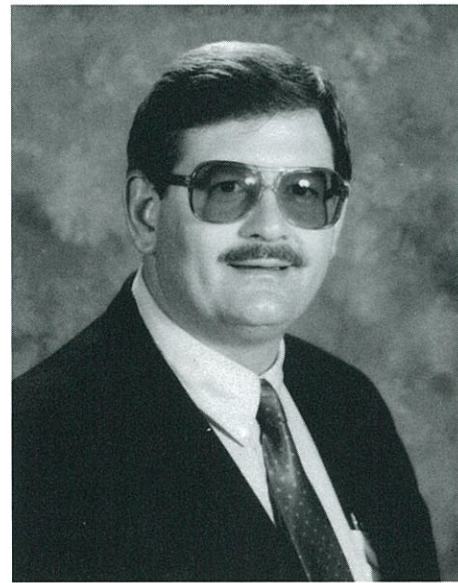
Campuses Excel in UIL Academics, Awards for Excellence

selected as finalist for the Mentor School Program, sponsored by the Texas Education Agency. In August, the elementary school was awarded \$30,000 for academic improvement and success. The money was used to equip elementary classrooms with Macintosh

computers and allowed sixth graders to take an overnight science trip to Prude Ranch and McDonald Observatory. Administrators and faculty members were proud that students at all three levels won the UIL district academic championships.
